In 2016, Erin made a courageous decision to resign and embark on a soul-searching mission. This transformative period led her to Livingstone, Zambia, where she dedicated six impactful weeks volunteering in schools and community programs, igniting her passion for humanitarian work in Africa. Upon her return, Erin's networking efforts led her to HealthPartners, a prominent US-based health nonprofit, where she joined their Uganda

field office. In Uganda, she immersed herself in local communities, forging deep connections, and making a meaningful impact through her involvement with the Rotary Club of Mbarara. Returning to the US in 2018, Erin pursued her graduate studies, focusing on Comparative and International Development Education, committed to enhancing education quality in under-resourced African primary schools. Her dedication to this cause led her to Africa Strong Inc., a nonprofit she joined in 2016, where she now serves as the volunteer Executive Director, pouring her heart and energy into empowering communities across Africa. In December 2021, Erin furthered her commitment by joining the board of Books For Africa, aligning with her passion for improving education access and literacy in Africa. She expresses gratitude to Central High School and schools throughout La Crosse for their support, facilitating the donation of books to Zimbabwe, Kenya, Somalia, and Tunisia, fostering a brighter future for countless individuals. Erin's journey exemplifies resilience, compassion, and a steadfast commitment to making a difference in the lives of others, both locally and globally.
