



## How do I apply for my child to attend a choice or charter school?

Parents should complete the online form found on the school district's website at [www.lacrosseschools.org](http://www.lacrosseschools.org). Select PARENTS/GUARDIANS tab to find the QUICK LINK on CHOICE AND CHARTER OPPORTUNITIES. Those without internet access can call 789-7654 for assistance.

Interest forms will be accepted through April 30<sup>th</sup> of each year. The deadline for priority consideration for current school district students is late December of each year. See district website for current year's deadlines.

## Is transportation provided to the choice and charter schools?



The School District of La Crosse provides bussing to the district's choice and charter schools from other elementary schools and the Hogan Administrative Center. When bussing is needed, parents are responsible for getting their child to the elementary school pick-up location at the appropriate time. Bussing is only provided during the traditional school calendar. Thus, Hamilton students needing transportation must plan accordingly based on their school's calendar. Bus routes are announced prior to the start of the school year each year.

## When will I know if my child has been accepted into the school?

Students with interest forms submitted during the Priority Placement window will be contacted in March. Open Enrolled and additional students will be notified by June of their placement.

## Frequently Asked Questions



### Is the same curriculum taught in all district schools?

Yes, the same high quality curriculum is taught in all district elementary schools, including the choice and charter schools. However, how the curriculum is delivered is different in these schools, which all have a specific area of focus or building-wide theme.

### What is the difference between the choice and charter schools and my neighborhood school?

The School District of La Crosse has three choice elementary schools, Hamilton Early Learning Center, North Woods International School and Summit Environmental School. These schools include students from neighborhood attendance areas as well as students that choose to attend. These schools deliver the elementary school curriculum using a thematic approach or have a unique school calendar as described in this brochure.

Coulee Montessori and the School of Technology and Arts I are charter schools. These schools are governed by a governing council that includes parents, community members and staff. Students come from throughout the district to attend these schools. Charter schools, including those in the School District of La Crosse, use unique and innovative instructional approaches to deliver their curriculum.

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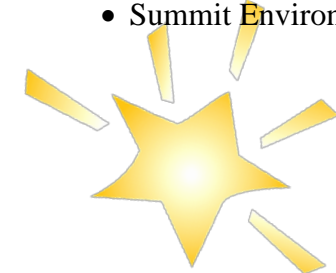
# Elementary Choice and Charter Schools

## Two Educational Strands

### Global Strand

- Academic curriculum linked to world events, geography, and world cultures.
- Each grade has a "Continent of Study" that is integrated into the curriculum.
- International guests and service learning projects connect local issues and topics to world events.

### Spanish Partial Immersion Strand

- Approximately 45 – 50% of classroom instruction is presented in the Spanish language.
- Spanish will be the primary language used in teaching the subjects of math, science and social studies.
- Each grade of the program is taught by a certified Spanish teacher.

## Hamilton Early Learning Center Year-Round School

Hamilton Early Learning Center is a preschool – 5<sup>th</sup> grade school that operates on a year-round calendar. **The school's innovative 45-15 day schedule operates the same number of days as the rest of the district**, but the days are dispersed more evenly throughout the school year. Hamilton's school calendar includes the same staff development days and holiday breaks as the district's traditional nine month school calendar.

The 45-15 calendar is designed to *best meet the needs of students* and tackle the "summer slide" that often occurs for learners over the extended summer break. Between quarter sessions (45 days), students will have the opportunity to register for three week intersessions that will include enrichment classes as well as math and reading intervention.
