What are the benefits to earning the Certificate of Global Competence?

This program is designed for students to engage in global learning across the curriculum in an effort to prepare them to be workforce-, world-, and life-ready with global competence. It helps you stand out among your peers on college applications and can enhance your future career opportunities.

Your program completion is indicated on your Logan High transcript and you receive a certificate from the State of Wisconsin. This credential serves as a college, career, and community readiness talent marker recognizing students' language, intercultural and global competence. You are also recognized at various student award ceremonies and by the La Crosse School Board.

What are the program requirements for the Certificate of Global Competence?

- I. 4 passing credits of the same World Language.
- II. An additional 4 passing credits of approved courses with a global focus. See the approved courses below:
 - A second World Language (only up to 1 credit in an additional language)
 - World Humanities (2 credits)
 - World History (1 credit)
 - Land and Cultures (.5 credit)
 - Sociology (.5 credit)
 - Global Partners HSA (.5 credit)
 - Global Issues in Healthcare HSA (1 credit)
 - Intro to Global Health (.5 credit)
 - Global Issues (.5 credit)
 - AP European History (1 credit)
 - AP Environmental Science (1 credit)
 - Servant Leadership-*encouraged to make project globally focused* (.5 credit)
 - World Cuisines (.5 credit)
- III. Be an active participant in 4 school sponsored global activities or clubs.
- IV. Complete independent reflections on 8 works of international or cultural media. Four must be books and the other four could include music, art, film, lectures and presentations.
- V. Complete 20 hrs of a global/cross cultural public service project that relates to one of the United Nation's Sustainable Development Goals.
