- The lessons learned during Cub Scouting allow a child to grow in their ability to be careful and responsible young people.
- Because kids get to do fun and exciting things in a safe environment.

Cub Scouting Teaches Your Child

- Builds confidence, through recognition by adults.
- Feelings of belonging, by building friendships with other children in their Pack and at their school
- Understand the value of family, by fostering quality family time for children and their adult partners.
- Enhances social skills, through interacting with other youth and adults.
- · Good decision making, by instilling values of helping others.
- About their community, by participating in field trips and other activities.

How Cub Scouting Works

- Each child is part of a Cub Scout Pack which has other families from their community/school in it.
- Some months, one other Cub Scout outing usually takes
 place for the kids: a field trip, outdoor activity, or attending a
 larger Cub Scout event.
- Cub Scouts learn many new skills and have new experiences
 earning belt loops and patches along the way.

What Is Expected of Us As A Family?

- Cub Scouting is a program that invites and encourages families to do the program together. The most impactful part of Cub Scouting is the involvement of parents.
- Your family will grow closer through the activities you do in Cub Scouting. Siblings often attend many Cub Scout meetings and activities.
- Many Cub Scout families are active in a variety of other activities as well. Cub Scouting is a program that can fit into a busy schedule as not every outing or meeting must be attended.
