

What do I do now?



Once you've completed your Youth Apprenticeship, receiving appropriate credit in a post-high school setting can look different. Please consider these guidances.

Elements to Consider:

<p>Do you have Transcribed Credit (aka "Dual Credit") available?</p>	<p><input type="checkbox"/> Pull your Transcript from Western Technical College for Transcribed credits (to then transfer to your college or university of choice, NOT just WTC). <input type="checkbox"/> Choose "Official Transcript" NOT "Unofficial Transcript." You will need your WTC student ID# -available from your counselor OR Dual Credit instructor at Logan or Central High School.</p>
<p>Is your resume updated?</p>	<p><input type="checkbox"/> Include your YA experience, complete with <i>specific</i> experiences and details.</p>
<p>Dept. of Workforce Development Certification</p>	<p><input type="checkbox"/> These often come up to a full year after your YA is completed but can still be referenced with an Academic Advisor or employer <input type="checkbox"/> Remember: <u>Any credit earned</u> as a YA (or in your high school experience), elective or program-specific, may be helpful in curbing college costs!</p>
<p>YA Employer Evaluations</p>	<p><input type="checkbox"/> <i>These are kept on file and contain your proficiency marks for Employability Skills AND Job Competencies. A copy can be made available for sharing upon request.</i></p>

What If I Get Stuck?

This process can be confusing and can vary from college to college, or it can vary from employer to employer for negotiating starting wages, too. You may, in fact, be eligible for more than you may realize, but it really is about self-advocating! Do not hesitate to reach out to us with ANY questions, clarifications, or advocating help.

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
