Birch Creek Elementary Parent and Family Engagement Policy

- 9. Build parent and family capacity, including:
 - a. Holding an annual Title I Information meeting
 - b. Parent Teacher Conferences
 - c. Curriculum home supports online [e.g. Go Math-lesson videos, Reading Counts]
 - d. Family Literacy Night/One Book One School
 - e. Home to School Connection Newsletter
 - f. Maturation Program for all 5th grade students and their parents
 - g. NOVA program, for 5th graders, in conjunction with Cache Sheriff's Office
 - h. Schoolwide Enrichment Model [SEM] Parent Nights
 - i. "Leader in Me" communication and informational assemblies
- 10. Parent and family engagement policy will be discussed in SCC, PTO board meeting, with faculty and others [including limited English speaking parents] to be approved annually for planning, review and improvement.
