I would like to set up some ground rules for this new learning experience.

- Please submit all work on time. All assignments are due by the end of the week they are assigned unless there is a different due date in Google Classroom. Make sure you're hitting that "Turn In" button when your work is complete.
- When commenting on Google Classroom, all spelling and grammar rules apply. This is still school! So, no text-talk, slang, or abbreviations.
- Be respectful to everyone. All comments and discussions must be relevant to the topic.
- A weekly planner will be posted in our homeroom Google Classroom. 19-20 6th Grade Ellgen
- I am still looking for quality work. On every assignment that is turned in, students should still do their best and answer with complete, thoughtful answers.

Procedure:

- Each "school" day, at 9:15am, I will post a discussion of the day in our homeroom Google Classroom.
 - **Discussion Question** that you must reply to. In addition, you must reply to <u>TWO</u> other classmates. Remember to use one of the following sentence-starters when you're replying:
 - o I agree with what you're saying when you said...
 - o I see what you're saying, but I disagree with you when you say...
 - o This reminds me of ...
 - o To add to what you are saying...
 - o Can you explain more? I'm confused when you say...
- Everyday check the weekly planner and our google classrooms for your daily assignments.
- Remember to be respectful and kind. The rules for a class discussion still apply to online. The homeroom discussion board is the ONLY board that will be open for discussion.

Lesson Structures

<u>ELA:</u> My class and I are piloting a new reading program. It is NOT a link that is provided in the district links page. This is because most students in the district don't have access to it. To get to Into Reading, the student needs to go to the following website https://www.ccsdut.org/intoreading. Bookmark it while it is still the CCSD webpage! Then click the thumbnail Into Reading. I will have things that students can do under the assignments tab. However, some lessons will require the students to read a text. At the home page, they need to click on the Module book that we are working in (currently it's Module 7). This will pull up a digital copy of their book that will read it aloud to them. I will also put screenshots of the text on the instruction slides. Feel free to explore this site. There are novels that they can read online.

Every lesson will follow this structure.

- 1. A Google Slide Presentation with a reading strategy to practice. A 20 min break to apply the reading strategy to either our class novel or their independent book. I will let you know what book we will be reading that day...
- 2. A Google Form to fill out while they are going through the lesson and submit once the lesson is complete. All answers must be answered with complete sentences and your very best work.
- 3. Journal-I have a journal page that I would like the students to respond to throughout the next little while. It is in the Language Arts Classroom.

Math: For every math lesson, I have provided you a Google Slide presentation. The slides and assignments will be found on Google Math Classroom. This slide starts with an introductory video. They can also look at the Math on the Spot videos that are on Think Central. I have linked the Math on the Spot videos on the Slides. While the videos are playing, the students need to take notes in their graph paper notebooks. Then they do an interactive lesson on Think Central. They need to follow the lesson and not just click the next arrow. The lesson will use a yellow highlight light when it wants them to click on something. After they have gone through the interactive student lesson, they need to do the corresponding assignment.

Look at the planner everyday to know what assignments need to be done for science and social studies. And again, please read everyday!! This will help so much!
