FRENCH 5 DLI A & B

1 Elective credit

Grades 9-11

Course # 4774, 4775

Prerequisite: Previous Enrollment in DLI or teacher approval

This 9th-grade course is a continuation of the French dual language immersion program and prepares students to take the French Language AP exam. Students will continue proficiency development in speaking, listening, reading and writing through language immersion. Narratives and dialogues are used to teach structure and vocabulary. Creative Scheduling options


Students can take up to 7.5 credits in a year 26 credits are required for graduation 7.5 credits * 4 years = 30 credits

Junior and Senior year there are opportunities to earn 9.0 credits in a year by taking credit earning courses during FLEX.

Delay some required courses

These courses are typically taken in 9th and 10th grade for progression purposes but COULD be taken later to make room now:

- Health
- Fitness for Life
- Digital Studies
- World Geography



Seminary

Consider taking it early morning or during FLEX Taking it in the regular school day means a student can only earn 6.5 credits that school year.

Seminary and Summer Term



Students may take up to 7.5 credits in a year Some online institutions offer free courses over the summer but they do count towards the 7.5 credits for the following school year.

This could be a good option for students who might feel overwhelmed taking Seminary during FLEX or Early AM

More credit and course opportunities 11th and 12th grade

Students may take BTech and Concurrent Enrollment Courses (where offered) during FLEX their Junior and Senior year. This allows a student to fit an extra .5 credit in their schedule for each trimester they do this.
