

Cache County School District 2020-2021 School Fees Spend Plan

SECTION A: General Information

1. Any payment for student participation in a class, program, or activity is a fee and is subject to the fee waiver requirements.
2. All fees listed are the **maximum amounts charged** per student for each class or school sponsored activity. Actual amount charged may be less.
3. All students are responsible to pay for any loss, breakage, or damage they cause to school property. Loss, breakage, or damage is not subject to the waiver requirement. Official transcripts may be withheld if breakage or damage costs are not paid in accordance with UCA 53G-8-212.
4. Donations are permissible in both elementary and secondary schools, but all such requests are voluntary. A student may not be excluded from an activity or program because they did not make a donation.
5. The amount specified for uniforms, travel, and clinics in high school is the total that may be spent whether from student contributions, fund raising activities, school subsidy, or donation.

SECTION B: Elementary School Fees - Grades K-6

Basic Fees (any class or regular school day activity, including assemblies and field trips).....	\$0
Before or after school activities/groups	\$1.00/day

- Provides the basic supplies for approved activities and groups.

SECTION C: Middle School Fees - Grades 7-8

Maximum per student/per year fee for SECTION C is \$150. This maximum does not include instrument rentals, additional class projects, listed non-waivable fees, and Bridgerland Technical College fees.

• Pay for a variety of activities that are provided for students, including but not limited to, lunch activities, intramural supplies, assemblies, prizes for contests, school rewards for accomplishing goals, incentives, student safety, school culture and climate activities, etc.

• Fund postage, paper, envelopes, newsletters, etc. for various mailings for the operation of the school. It includes communication to parents, both written and electronic.	
Locker	\$5
• Cleaning, maintenance, and repair or replacement of student lockers.	
Computer/Writing/Science labs.....	\$20
• Maintenance and repair of electronic devices, including keyboards, monitors, and mice. Purchase technology and software, provide necessary supplies including printing paper, for computer and writing labs. Purchase necessary supplies and equipment for science labs.	
Digital Curriculum Access, Canvas.....	\$8
• District required CANVAS fee per student and provider support for access to digital curriculum.	
Student Planner.....	\$5
• Purchase a school planner for each student.	
College and Career Awareness (7 th Grade).....	\$10
• Cover the cost of consumable materials and supplies for Utah Core Curriculum directed lessons.	
Digital Literacy (8 th Grade)	\$10
• Software licensing and maintenance of computers, keyboards, monitors, & mice.

• Cover the cost of consumables and necessary supplies.	
Band, Orchestra	\$8
• Sheet music, printing, consumables, licensing instrument repair and necessary supplies.	
Instrument Rental/Usage/Repairs/Cleaning (per instrument)	\$105
• Rental, repair, and maintenance of instruments and cases.	
P.E. Uniform (as needed).....	\$15
• Purchase required PE uniform. Cover the cost of the uniform.

Art, Ceramics.....	\$10
• Cover the cost of materials.	
Choir.....	\$8
• Sheet music, printing, consumables, etc.	
Career and Technical Education consumable supplies (project materials are extra).....	\$10
• 8th grade class. It covers the cost of the materials that are consumable.	
Guitar	\$8
• Sheet music, printing, consumables, etc.	
After school programs (per class).....	\$25
• After school program is optional. The fee helps cover the cost of hiring tutors and instructors as well as any materials that are consumed.

• Pay for the cost of the bus for field trips.

Yearbook.....	\$20
• Cover the costs of producing the yearbook.	
After school or summer core remediation (per class).....	\$40
• Maximum charge for an after school or summer core class.

SECTION D: High School Fees - Grades 9-12

Maximum per student/per year fee for SECTION D is \$350. This maximum does not include instrument rentals, driver education, additional class projects, graduation fee, listed non-waivable fees, and Bridgerland Technical College fees.

Basic Registration Fees

• Cover costs associated with extra-curricular activities, i.e. dances, homecoming events, athletic events, student leadership, etc.

• Licensing costs for student program usage for canvas and other online teaching components.

• Covers cost of cleaning and repairing lockers in the main halls as well as PE locker rooms. This fee also covers costs for changing locker combinations from year to year.	
Postage (student mailings).....	\$5
• Covers envelopes, stamps, summer mailings, financial statements, etc.	
Graduation (seniors only).....	\$35

• For music and instrument maintenance, repairs and purchases.	
Driver Ed. in school / after school, summer, on-line (includes the drive, Street Smarts) was	\$140/\$170
• Covers cost of instructors for class and drive time, insurance, fuel, and automotive needs.	
Driver Education (drive only).....	\$140
• Covers cost of instructors drive time, insurance, fuel, and automotive needs.	
Foreign Language, Dual Language Immersion.....	\$8
• Covers cost for class materials and cultural experiences.	
Instrument Rental/Usage/Repairs/Cleaning (per instrument)	\$105
• Rental, repair, and maintenance of instruments and cases.

• Covers consumable class supplies in art and CTE internship, certification cost for CPR with the Red Cross, and lifeguards and pool maintenance for swimming.	
AP Fine Arts, Art II, Painting I, Painting II.....	\$40
• Covers the cost of consumable art supplies	
Calculator Rental.....	\$8
• Covers the cost to purchase and replace calculators.	
Choir	\$15
• Sheet music, printing, consumables, etc.	
Concurrent Enrollment consumable supplies (\$5 per class)	\$5
• Covers class supplies.	
Career and Technical Education consumable supplies (elective project materials are extra/non-fee waivable).....	\$10
• Covers class supplies.	
Drama.....	\$60
• Covers costs associated with drama productions, costumes, sets, supplies, and production rights and licensing.	
Guitar	\$8
• Covers sheet music instrument and maintenance.	
Green Canyon High School Ice Skating (Eccles Ice Center)	\$50
• Covers equipment rental, ice time and instruction.	
Advanced Choir.....	\$30
• Covers sheet music and piano accompaniment.	
Textbooks for Concurrent Enrollment & Advanced Placement courses are selected by the university.....	as published
• Covers cost of textbooks required by the university.

• Covers proctoring and test.

• Covers test and possible proctoring.

• Cost of test.	
Summer or Evening Core Remediation (per class).....	\$50
• This fee is for credit recovery, teacher salary & grading. Pays for a packet or online program fee. Some courses are at Cache High.	
Yearbook.....	\$45
• Cost of the book, stipend for advisor, and needed technology.	
<u>University Admission Fee, Class Fees:</u>	
USHE (Utah System of Higher Education) one-time enrollment fee per institution (\$50-USU).....	per USHE
• USU or any college admissions one time enrollment fee per institution.	
USHE Tuition fee.....	\$5 per credit
• This fee is set by the higher education institution.	
Non-Curricular Student Sponsored Clubs.....	as published
• Each school has clubs that do not fall into the regular curricular category. These clubs have fees based on the needs of each club in order to function. This includes court rentals, uniforms, fees, etc.	

SECTION F: Utah High School Activities Association (UHSAA) Activity Fees

Per sport/activity maximums includes participation fee, transportation fee, uniform fee, participant packs, off-campus and on-campus clinics, IHC sports conditioning, and other associated travel costs. ¹These fees may be less than listed.

SECTION H: Travel

All transportation costs for preseason and region *UHSAA activities within 200 miles will be split 80/20 (80% district, 20% school). Schools will cover 100% of the transportation costs for activities beyond 200 miles. The district will cover 100% of the transportation costs for teams that qualify for state play-off games. When choosing to participate in extracurricular activities please refer to each individual disclosure statement for details and estimated travel costs.
