**Visitors:**

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1. Review of minutes from December's meeting. Amy made a motion to approve the minutes. Randy seconded the motion.
  2. Randy reviewed upcoming events at the school. (see agenda)
  3. Randy reviewed the data report for 2022-2023, the increases and decreases in Math, ELA, and Science. Overall there was an increase in most areas and scores are higher than the state average.

Rise data collected since the 2019-2020 school year is continuing to improve overall. On the 2021-2022 Rise test, 46% of students were proficient in LA, 61 % proficient in math, and 47 % proficient in science. By comparison, during the 2022-2023 school year, the most recent administration of end of level testing, 52% of students were proficient in LA, 56% proficient in math, and 51% proficient in science. Last year's data represent a 4% gain in LA, a 5% drop in math, and a 4% gain in science from the 2021-2022 school year.

Rise testing results from 2023 show that our ELL population had a 6% gain in Language arts, a 2% drop in math scores, and a 13% gain in science scores.

Rise testing results from 2023 show that our Sped population had a 15% gain in Language arts, a 7% gain in math scores, and a 5% gain in science scores.

Rise testing results from 2023 show that our low income population had a 5% gain in Language arts, a 7% drop in math scores, and a 8% gain in science scores.

Our students performed 11 percentage points above the state average in language arts, 14 percentage points above the state average in math, and 5 percentage points above the state average in science.

In most cases, our minority, special education, and low income students have made extra big growth margins in the core tested areas. (see data listed above) We continue to place extra energy and effort into helping our ELL students make additional gains academically. We

recognize that we need additional time, resources, and support to continue in our educational efforts.

4. Randy gave a safety report of what is being installed at the school as well as an update on first aid responders, reunification plans, and more security cameras being installed at the school.
5. Next month we will be talking about the trustlands budget and things that will be included in the plan.
