Minutes for School Community Council meeting dated 04/06/2016.

Minutes from our previous meeting were approved unanimously.

Principal Williams presented to us 2016-2017 Trustland Plan and Budget Approval.

- 1. Three of our School Improvement Plan goals deal with improving SAGE scores in Math, Language Arts, and Science. These will be measured by comparing SAGE scores between years. AMP homeroom will be used to help improve these scores.
  - a. \$1000 has been budgeted for a "Beyond Illusions" assembly, scheduled for September 14, 2016. This assembly is designed to teach adolescents how to develop a true perception of who they are and help them filter through false impressions. They will also learn sound decision makings skills. This will take the place of the 3-screens assembly that we normally do.
  - b. \$49,000 has been budgeted for the Adult Mentor Program.
  - c. \$3800 has been budgeted for Renaissance Software.
  - d. \$7200 has been budgeted for Promethean Activslates and 5 new projectors.
- 2. The fourth goal deals with having a writing assignment in every content area to improve writing skills. Many teachers use Utah Compose for this. Language Arts Sage scores will be used to measure this. Teacher training on Utah Compose is needed to accomplish this goal.
  - a. \$1800 has been budgeted for SIRS, a research engine.
  - b. \$4825 has been budgeted to purchase five new desktop computers.

## In summary,

\$1000 has been budgeted for Behavioral/Character Education \$49,000 has been budgeted for Salaries and Employee Benefits \$5,600 has been budgeted for Software \$16,025 has been budgeted for Equipment

This totals to \$71,625.

All present members approved the plan. Present members then signed the approval form. Other members can electronically submit their approval through an email sent out Wednesday morning.

The motion to adjourn the meeting was placed and approved.
