

National School Lunch week is coming up on October 12 - 14. Come and eat lunch with your students! We would like to remind parents to pre-pay ahead of time for their




lunch tickets to eat with their student. Cash or check only (we can't take cards). There will be a table set up in front of the Gym if parents need to pur-


chase a ticket the day of.

From the Principal's Office:

Dear Parents and Students,

I can't believe that October is already here! We have had a fantastic first month of school. Thank you parents for helping your children get a great start into a new school year. I also want to thank our PTA for the numerous ways they have helped us kick off a new school year, including the "Green Ribbon" week and the Walk-a-Thon in September. Heritage Elementary is a special place because of the countless ways in which the Nibley community supports education. We appreciate the time, attention, and care you give to making our school a great place to learn. Parents, I can't think of anything that does more good for a school than your continued involvement and support of teachers and students in the educational process.

We are looking forward to seeing everyone at our Parent-Teacher Conferences on October 8th and 9th. I want to encourage everyone to schedule a time to meet with your teacher. You should have received instructions for scheduling conferences online. If you need assistance scheduling your conference, please call the school office. As you prepare to attend conferences with your student, I invite you to consider a few ways you can support his/her learning at school:

- Help ensure that your child arrives at school on time every day!
- Plan responsibly in order to limit the number of days students must miss school.
- Talk with your child about school.
- Set aside a consistent time and place for homework and reading.
- Review your child's blue homework folder every night; discuss assignments and help ensure that homework is completed and returned on time.
- Read with your child at least 20 minutes each
- Volunteer in your child's classroom.
- Make regular contact with the classroom teacher and attend Parent Teacher conferences.
- Ask your teacher for additional ideas on how you can support your student.

I also want to take a minute to publically thank Nibley City for installing a new segment of sidewalk on the east side of the school. For students who walk or ride bikes to the east, this new sidewalk allows us to safely cross at the crosswalk near the flag pole, rather than out at the busy intersection on 3200 South. I also want to thank Nibley City for their crossing guards who are posted at crosswalks both east and west of the school along 3200 South from 8:30 - 9:15 and 3:15 - 4:00 PM after school.



Now. I have saved some exciting news for last . . . We received the SAGE Assessment results from the end of level tests for the 2014-15 school year. Once again, Cache County School District outperformed every other school system in the state of Utah. In addition, Heritage Elementary performed well in the top of all elementary schools in the district. Heritage was ranked in the top 25 elementary schools in the entire state for Mathematics and Science, while still performing significantly higher than the state average in Language Arts. When we consider that there are approximately 600 elementary schools in Utah, this is a significant accomplishment. The education of our students is a community effort and I hope you will all join me in celebrating together! Sincerely,
