*Fullback*

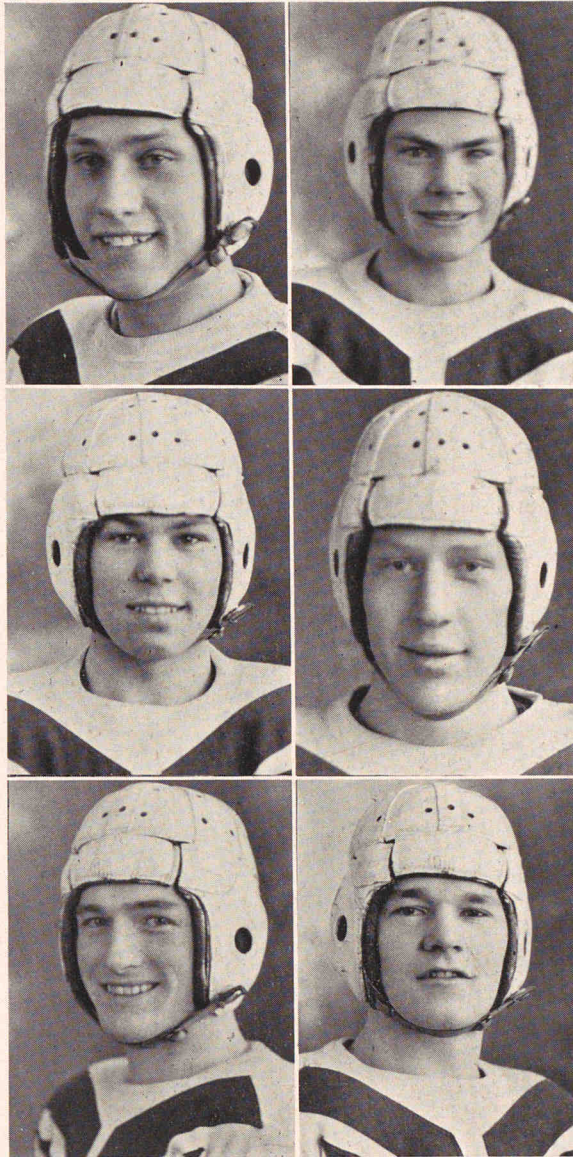
