The JROTC Program at Sonora has been a Nationally recognized **Honor Unit with Distinction** since 2006 and has many incentives:

- JROTC has the National Military Honor Society of Scabbard and Blade and cadets can earn membership
- JROTC is a College-Preparatory Elective "G" Interdisciplinary for all four years as well as a PE credit (Must complete 2 years)
- Cadets can earn a College Prep "F" Elective for Visual & Performing Arts for being on the Competitive Drill Team
- Cadets who complete 4 years of JROTC can earn a graduation stole and cord
- Cadets can earn a JROTC Varsity Letter by being a member of our JROTC Special Teams/Competitive Drill Team
- Cadets who meet certain criteria are annually awarded Nationally recognized awards which enhances college applications, resumes and job applications.


