APPROVAL OF THE LOWELL JOINT SCHOOL DISTRICT GUIDING GOALS AND VISION 2025 It was moved, seconded, and carried by unanimous vote (5 - 0) to approve the consultant agreement with National Demographics Corporation for the transition to a By-Trustee Area election, for an estimated cost of \$21,500 plus expense, and authorized the Superintendent or designee to execute the necessary documents.

A public hearing was held at 7:55 p.m. A person from the public shared that the District has a great history of representing the community and feels that the switch to a By-Trustee Area was not necessary. He also stated that with the criteria it does not appear that any gerrymandering will occur.

The public hearing was closed at 7:58 p.m., after hearing no further comments.

	Mr. Varzatkas shared the post construction Division of State Architect (DSA) certification projects at Meadow Green, Olita, and Rancho-Starbuck. The scope of work included restriping parking lots for accessibility and path of travel; adding miscellaneous hardware on portable classroom foundation plates; extracting concrete core samples for column foundation on lunch shelters for testing; extracting steel samples from lunch shelter canopies for testing; adjusting ADA ramps for accessibility and path of travel; modifying fire alarm systems; and adding a structural steel column. The projected cost for the completion of the post certification process is estimated not to exceed \$170,000.
