Academic Programs

- ★ All schools received an 830 or above on the Academic Performance Index
- ★ The District achieved higher at every grade level in ELA and Math than Orange County (except on math in sixth grade), Los Angeles County, and the State on the CST tests
- ★ Continued to implement *Step-Up-To-Writing* as the District writing program and 7th Grade CST Writing scores continue to increase at Rancho-Starbuck Junior High School

Academic Programs (cont.)

- ★ Offered all-day Kindergarten at Jordan Elementary School
- ★ Maintained reduced class size (25:1) in Kindergarten through 2nd grade
- ★ Continued to utilize the *MIND Institute ST Math Program* at all six schools
- ★ Implemented the *Ticket To Read Program* at all elementary school

Academic Programs (cont.)

- ★ All schools offered after-school academic intervention classes
- ★ Provided professional development training for teachers, classified staff members, and administrators
- ★ Provided before- and after-school childcare program at El Portal, Jordan, Macy and Meadow Green Elementary Schools
- ★ Working with the Lowell Joint Education Foundation, offered after-school sports at Rancho-Starbuck Junior High School, hosted Academic Excellence Day, and awarded \$2,000 technology grants to each school
- ★ Continued to provide character education and patriotic emphasis

Technology

- ★ Received a grant donation from Southern California Edison of 65 computers (10 for each of the elementary schools and 15 for Rancho-Starbuck Junior High School)
- ★ Installed new computers and upgraded software at all of the school sites
- ★ Installed fiber optics from the Los Angeles County Office of Education to the District Office to increase the bandwidth capabilities in the District

Nutrition Services

- ★ Added new healthy meal choices, including a wider variety of fresh fruits and vegetables for student lunches
- ★ Nutrition Services served 188,261 lunches and 64,747 Grab & Go meals, ending the fiscal year with a positive budget balance for the third consecutive year

Maintenance of Facilities

- ★ Repainted and recarpeted interiors of classrooms throughout the District
- ★ Painted the outside of classroom buildings and classroom interiors as needed
- ★ Completed over 2,000 work-order requests throughout the District in order to address safety issues and improve cleanliness in the classrooms and restrooms
