### What happens if the budget fails?

- At this time, there is no date for a revote should the proposed budget be defeated. Therefore, a defeated budget will likely result in the district needing to adopt a contingency budget, which would result in \$2,358,831 worth of reductions.

Under a contingency budget, the district would need to possibly eliminate approximately 20-30 positions. With the loss of those positions, the following areas would be affected:

- Increased class sizes at all levels, K-12.
- Reduction of support staff, including social workers, psychologists, guidance counselors and teacher aides and assistants.
- Loss of elective courses at the high school.

In addition to potential loss of staff and increased class sizes, to accommodate \$2,358,831 worth of reductions, the following programs would be considered for elimination:

- All varsity, junior varsity, and middle school interscholastic sports.
- All intramural programs.
- Teen program.
- All elementary, middle school, and high school clubs and activities.
