Instructional Materials	Parents and guardians can access other supplementary materials through the Schoology platform.
Course Description	In this hands-on class, students will explore the basics of sculpture using materials like clay, wire, and paper mâché. They'll learn different techniques to create their own 3D art pieces, while developing creativity and problem-solving skills. No experience is needed—just bring your imagination!
Course Objectives	Develop Fundamental Sculpture Skills: Students will learn and apply basic sculpting techniques such as modeling, carving, and assembling using various materials.  Enhance Creative Expression: Students will explore their creativity by designing and constructing original three-dimensional artworks that express their ideas and imagination.  Understand and Apply Art Concepts: Students will gain an understanding of key art concepts like form, texture, and space, and how they relate to creating sculptures.
Classroom Expectations	<ol> <li>No cell phones allowed during instructional time.</li> <li>Be seated and ready for class when the bell rings. Students tardy to class will receive a detention per LMS policy.</li> <li>Come prepared for class. Bring all necessary supplies.</li> <li>Respect your teacher, your classmates, the classroom supplies, and yourself.</li> <li>If it's not yours, don't touch it. Technology Policy	Students should bring their MCS chromebooks and chargers to class each day. Teachers utilize GoGuardian to monitor student activity and participation; however, students are responsible for their activity on school-issued devices and using their MCS accounts.  Students are welcome to bring personal cell phones to school to be used between classes and during lunch. Students will not be allowed to use cell phones during class. All cell phones must be placed in students' backpacks or cell phone station during the entirety of the instructional block. Grading Policy (MCS Policy)	60% = Assessments (Tests, Essays, Projects) 40% = Daily Grades (Quizzes, Homework, Classwork, and Participation)

Late Work Policy	Late work can be submitted for full credit until the semester grading period ends. Students may work on late work in class or at home. After the semester ends and grades are finalized, no late work can be accepted. Before a student submits late work, a zero will be placed in the gradebook.
Make-up Work/Test Policy	Students with excused absences will be allowed to make-up all work within three days of returning to school. It is the student's responsibility to ask for make-up work. Students can get with a classmate or ask the teacher for help. Work that is not made up will become a zero (including quizzes/tests).
Homework	Homework is not assigned in sculpture class.
