COLLEGE AND CAREER READINESS (CCR)

On <u>November 10, 2022</u>, the Alabama State Board of Education amended the *Alabama Administrative Code*, Rule No. 290-3-1.02, which added a College and Career Readiness Indicator to the Alabama High School Graduation Requirements. On <u>December 14, 2023</u>, the Alabama State Board of Education amended the *Alabama Administrative Code*, Rule No. 290-3-1.02 requiring CCR attainment for students who are members of the graduating Class of 2026 (and beyond) and are pursuing the *Alabama High School Diploma: General Education Pathway*. CCR can be earned through one of the nine options listed below:

- Earn a benchmark score in any subject area on the ACT College Entrance Exam.
- Earn a qualifying score of three or higher on an Advanced Placement Exam.
- Earn a qualifying score of four or higher on an International Baccalaureate Exam.
- Earn college credit while in high school.
- Earn a silver or gold level on the ACT WorkKeys Exam.
- Complete an in-school youth apprenticeship program.
- Earn a career tech industry credential listed on the compendium of valuable credentials of the Alabama Committee on Credentialing and Career Pathways.
- Military enlistment.
- Attain Career and Technical Education (CTE) completer status.

CTE COMPLETER STATUS

To meet the CCR Indicator as a <u>CTE Completer</u>, a student must earn **three (3.0) credits** with the **grade of a "C" or higher** in CTE courses that are part of an approved CTE program of study.

GUIDELINES FOR CTE COMPLETER STATUS

- Earn a maximum of **one (1.0) credit** by completing an approved CTE program **foundation course** (Career Prep can only be counted as a foundation course in Business, Marketing, or Finance).
- Earn a minimum of one (1.0) credit by completing an approved CTE program concentrator course.
- Earn one (1.0) additional credit by completing an approved CTE program concentrator course <u>OR</u> one (1.0) credit by completing one of the following approved CTE program capstone course(s):
 - Earn one (1.0) credit through completion of an authentic Work-Based Learning (WBL) experience in the field of study or a closely related field of study that meets the Alabama State Department of Education WBL requirements (e.g. Internship or Cooperative Education in-field placement or closely related field).
 - Earn one (1.0) credit through completion of an approved CTE cluster lab course that meets specific guidelines related to hours and activities.
 - Earn one (1.0) credit through completion of an approved CTE cluster pathway project course that meets specific guidelines related to hours and activities.

On December 14, 2023, the Alabama State Board of Education amended the Alabama Administrative Code Rule No. 290-3-1.02, to align the Alabama High School Graduation Requirements with the following actions taken during the 2023 Alabama Legislative Session:

Act #2023-179, adding the Financial Literacy Course and Examination Requirements.

 Act #2023-365, requiring College and Career Readiness (CCR) attainment for students who are members of the graduating Class of 2026 and are pursuing the Alabama High School Diploma: General Education Pathway.

This guidance will remain on the Alabama State Department of Education Web site and will be updated as additional details are determined.
