Course Description	9 Weeks Course Scholars Bowl II is an advanced level class for 7th and 8th grade students. Students should be experienced in Scholars Bowl format and expectations through Scholars Bowl I. Students entering this class should have knowledge and quick recall of all major world capitals, important historical figures, science, literature, mathematics, and fine arts. Students in this class will be expected to compete on the competition teams, with most competitions occurring on Saturday mornings in schools throughout the state.
Course Objectives	By the time the course is finished, students will be able to:  - Compete against other middle schools in Alabama Scholastic Competition Association (ASCA) Scholars Bowl tournaments.  - Recall the facts commonly asked at Scholars Bowl competitions with 80 percent accuracy in their chosen mastery areas.  - Mastery areas will be chosen by students  - Students will develop question sets to share with other team members to facilitate study and team practice.  - Students will demonstrate knowledge and understanding of rules governing ASCA tournaments.  - Students will develop skills for managing stress, working as a team, and enhancing learning and memory.

Cell Phone Procedures	Cell phones and earbuds/headphones will not be allowed to be used during classroom instruction time. Phones and earbuds/headphones will be put away in a location designated by the teacher and placed in silent mode. Late Work Policy	Late work in CTE/STEM classes will not be accepted due to the brief nature of the classes. Students are expected to follow up with teachers upon return from an excused absence.  Students present in class on the day of instruction are expected to turn in all in-class and out-of-class assignments on time.
Make-up Work/Test Policy	Students with excused absences will be allowed to make-up all work within <b>three</b> days of returning to school. It is the <b>student's responsibility</b> to ask for make-up work. Students can get with a classmate or ask the teacher for help. Work that is not made up will become a zero (including tests/quizzes). Many times, missed quizzes and tests can be made up during school.
Technology	Student laptops should not be hard-wired to the network or have print capabilities. Use of discs, flash drives, jump drives, or other USB devices will not be allowed on Madison City computers. Neither the teacher nor the school is responsible for broken, stolen, or lost laptops.
