Late Work Policy	 Late work in CTE/STEM classes will not be accepted due to the brief nature of the classes. Students are expected to follow up with teachers upon return from an excused absence. Make-up Work/Test Policy	Under normal circumstances, it is expected that students will submit previously assigned work upon return to school after an excused absence.
