Dear Mapleton School District Families,

After meeting with staff and communicating with families, I am excited to share with you our plan for reopening our schools to full day instruction. According to the new Metrics from the Oregon Department of Education and Oregon Health Authority, we are currently in the “Elementary On-Site and Hybrid Transition” Instructional Model column (*see attached metric chart*). This means, we can prioritize careful phasing in of On-Site or Hybrid Instruction for Elementary students.

Our reopening timeline, on the next page, is dependent on what the weekly Lane County COVID-19 Case Rate Metrics are. We are currently forecasting that the Metrics will allow us to reopen to Middle School and High School students per our timeline, however, if the metrics do not allow it, we will need to adjust our timeline.

As we transition to On-Site Learning, there are four instructional models offered to Mapleton Students depending on grade level and parental preference. These instructional models are based on the size of each cohort/grade level, size of learning space, number of staff, transportation and ability to follow all safety protocols and guidelines for school reopening as stated in the Ready Schools, Safe Learners Guidance from Oregon Department of Education.

The four instructional models offered are:

- On-Site Hybrid Learning for all K-6th grade students. Students will be on campus 2 days a week, attending a full school day. Students will be working virtually from home 2 days a week. *See attached On-Site/Hybrid Instructional Model Flyer for details*
- On-Site Learning will be offered to all Preschool students. Students will be on campus 2 days a week. *Start and end times TBD. Preschool students who do not choose On-Site Learning will still receive weekly Learning Kits.*
- On-Site Learning will be offered to all 7th-12th grade students. Students will be on campus 4 days a week, attending a full school day. *See attached On-Site/Hybrid Instructional Model Flyer for details*
- Comprehensive Distance Learning (CDL) will be offered to all Kindergarten-12th grade students who choose to remain in virtual learning. Once a student begins Comprehensive Distance Learning, they will remain in that instructional model until the end of the school year. *See attached Comprehensive Distance Learning Flyer for details*
