## Qualifications of School Board Candidates

Before an individual may serve on a school board, he or she must meet the qualifications to run for the public office and serve on the board. An individual is eligible to be a candidate for, or elected or appointed to, a public elective office in this state if he or she:

- 1. Is a United States Citizen
- 2. Is 18 years of age or older on the first day of the term to be filled at the election or on the date of appointment as applicable
- 3. Has not been determined by a final judgment of a court exercising probate jurisdiction to be totally mentally incapacitated or partially mentally incapacitated without the right to vote
- 4. Has not been finally convicted of a felony from which the person has not been pardoned or otherwise released from the resulting disabilities
- 5. Has resided continuously in the state for 12 months and in the territory/district from which the office is elected for six months immediately preceding the following date:
  - For an independent candidate (school board candidate), the date of the regular filing deadline for a candidate's application for a place on the ballot
  - b. For a write-in candidate, the date of the election at which the candidate's name is written in
  - c. For an appointee to an office, the date the appointment is made
- 6. Is a registered voter on the date indicated in subsection (5) above
- 7. Satisfies any other eligibility requirements prescribed by law for the office

Additionally, an individual seeking to run for a place on the school board must be a qualified voter at the time of the election.
