

School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

♦ What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Mt. Pleasant Middle School will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. We value the contributions and involvement of families to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Mt. Pleasant Middle School will support family engagement and how families can help and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

♦ How is it revised?

Administrator, staff, and parent representatives meet to develop and revise the Parent & Family Engagement Plan. MPMS appreciates parental feedback throughout the year. All feedback will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. Families can give feedback during several meetings and activities during the school year.

♦ Who is it for?

Students and family members are invited to participate in the opportunities described in this plan. MPMS will provide full opportunity for the participation of all students and parents including our community members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory families.

♦ Where is it available?

The plan will be posted on the school website and social media. Families can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the front office of the school.

♦ What is Title I?

MPMS has been identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). This decision is based on our demographics, specifically the number of school families with low income. Title I schools receive additional supports including federal funding to help meet the needs of our students.

PARENT AND FAMILY ENGAGEMENT

Family engagement means the participation of parents and family members in regular two-way, meaningful communication involving student academic learning and other school activities, including assuring:

- That parents play an integral role in assisting their child's learning.
- That parents are encouraged to be actively involved in their child's education at school.
- That parents are full partners in their child's education and are included, as appropriate, in decisionmaking and on advisory committees to assist in the education of their child.

2022-2023 DISTRICT GOALS

- ⇒ Increase of 10% on track or mastered in all grades on TN Ready for math.
- ⇒ Increase the percentage of students who are on track or mastered to 30% on TCAP for ELA.



2022-2023 MPMSVPA SCHOOL GOALS

- ⇒ For math, increase the percentage of on-track or mastered from 17% to 22% in 5th grade, from 23% to 28% in 6th grade, from 24% to 29% in 7th grade, and from 7% to 13% in 8th grade.
- ⇒ For ELA, increase the percentage of on-track or mastered from 19% to 24% in 5th grade, from 33% to 37% in 6th grade, from 36% to 44% in 7th grade, and from 3% to 15% in 8th grade.

2022-2023 STUDENT GOALS

Teachers and students work together to develop and track personal learning goals. Parents will be notified of progress of these goals by progress reports and parent-teacher conferences. If you would like to provide input for personal learning goals, please contact your child's teachers.





Mt. Pleasant Middle School will take the following measures to empower and support parents and family members as an important foundation of our school in order to strengthen the school and reach our goals.
