COURSE SYLLABUS

Course Description: Spanish 1 is an introductory course designed to provide students with a strong foundation in the Spanish language. Through a combination of interactive activities, listening exercises, speaking practice, reading comprehension, and writing exercises, students will develop basic communication skills in Spanish, including vocabulary and grammar knowledge. Emphasis will be placed on developing conversational abilities to engage in simple, everyday interactions.

Course Objectives: By the end of this course, students should be able to:

- Introduce themselves and others, exchanging basic personal information.
- Engage in simple conversations about everyday topics, such as hobbies, interests, and family.
- Describe people, places, and objects using basic adjectives.
- Ask and answer questions related to time, dates, and schedules.
- Understand and respond to simple written texts in Spanish.
- Demonstrate an awareness and appreciation of Hispanic culture and traditions.

Assessment Methods:

- Quizzes and Tests: Regular assessments to gauge students' understanding of vocabulary, grammar, and language concepts.
- Speaking and Listening Activities: In-class conversations, role-plays, and listening exercises.
- Written Assignments: Short paragraphs, dialogues, and journal entries in Spanish.
- Homework: Regular assignments to reinforce learning outside the classroom.
- Participation: Active engagement in class activities, discussions, and group work.
