## Welcome to English I 2023-2024

This class is dedicated to improving your skills in critical thinking, writing, and reading. English I is a course intended to expose students to a variety of literature types and genres. Additional emphasis is placed on increasing the complexity of works studied, critical thinking, and mastery of literary devices. Studies will be guided, trained, and practiced in producing various examples of written and graphic pieces of work, including but not limited to, essays, letters and constructed responses. The work expected will be rigorous and under time constraint. Each day you will have a bellwork assignment in the form of a writing prompt or grammar exercise. We will read and study great works of literature such as *The Odyssey*, *Romeo and Juliet*, *The Hunger Games (etc.)*, and short stories from our literature book. It is the intent of this course to prepare students for continued and more sophisticated classwork, time and task management, organization, as well as preparing them for high-stakes assessments.

#### **Course Goals**

- Develop and craft communication skills written and verbal
- Gain exposure to significant pieces of literature
- Engage in discussion and analysis relative to the relationship between literature and historical events
- Expanded variety/complexity of vocabulary in written and verbal communications
- Prepare students for next-level instruction
- Improve test taking strategies and management of high stakes testing scenarios
- Improve validating statements and assertions with textual evidence, including appropriate documentation and citation

- Do NOT speak during instruction raise your hand
