Course Overview:

The African American experience is a broad and deep subject. The study of that experience will be examined, beginning in Africa, the birthplace of civilization and will extend to the history of blacks in America. It is impossible to capture each element of the journey, but our analysis will be an interdisciplinary approach to explore some of the political, cultural, economic, artistic and social themes that illustrate the influence of the construction of African American realities in the past and present. Class sessions will be composed of lectures, discussions, exercises, film screenings, media and textual analysis in an online format.

- Expect to be respected and to display respect for others.
- Expect to be challenged.
- Expect to read, write, and think.
- Expect to be an active participant in class.
- Expect to be on time for class and to turn in work on time.

Assessment

- Students are responsible for turning in work on time to receive full-credit. Late assignments will receive little to no credit.
- 100% of student's final grade will be based on points earned for his/her unit exams, mid-term exam, quizzes, projects, papers, classwork, and homework. 15% of student's final grade will be based on his/her challenge exam score.
- Tests-40%, Classwork/Homework-30%, Quizzes/Projects-15%, Final-15%
- Course grading scale (per district requirements): A=90-100 B=80-89 C=70-79
- D=60-69 F=0-69
- Homework and classwork may or may not be collected.
- Plagiarized work will earn a grade of zero for all participants involved with plagiarism.
- Students who submit online assignment without a typed name will earn a grade of zero.
- Student grades will be posted in a timely fashion on Synergy.

Make Up Work

- Following an absence, it is the student's responsibility to visit the assignment folder in the classroom or speaking with their study buddy for all missed assignments.
- The Google Classroom site contains detailed information for many assignments and Remind texts will be sent regularly. There are NO EXCUSES for being unaware or unprepared.
- Per CHS US History department's policy make up is due three days following the absence. If an assignment has been collected, graded, and returned to the class, the specific student's missing assignment will earn a grade of zero.
- Missed quizzes or exams will be made up during class time the day the absent student returns to class.

Policies and Procedures

- With Chrome books to use in the classroom, there is no need for additional cellular/electronic devices.
- There is a "Double O" cell phone and electronic device policy in Mr. Szydlowski's classroom (1078 or other class meeting areas). All cell phones, earbuds, or any other electronic devices must be turned OFF and stored OUT OF SITE (in a backpack, purse, etc.) from bell to bell (tardy bell that starts class to dismissal bell).
- Students with any visible cell phone, earbuds, or other electronic device will incur the first, second, and third office referral system outlined in the CHS Student Handbook.
- If at any time you are charging your phone in my classroom and we are not using technology, the cellular device needs to be out of sight.
- Students are required to read, sign, return, and follow a Classroom Technology Agreement.
- Students will be allowed limited bathroom passes during instructional class time. If there are medical issues that require excessive bathroom visits, please alert Mr. Szydlowski via e-mail or a doctor's note.
