What is Title?

J.R. Baker Elementary has been identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Act (ESSA). This decision is based on our demographics, specifically, the number of school families with low income. Title I schools receive additional supports including federal funding to help meet the needs of our students.

2021/2022 DISTRICT GOALS

The board of Education sets goals for the district. The district goals relevant to our school for the 2020-2021 school year are:

Reading-Decrease percentage of students in grades k-2 who are below the 90th percentile in the national norms on Aimsweb.

Kindergarten-phoneme segmentation from 20% (spring benchmark 2019) to 90% and non-sense words from 6% (spring benchmark 2019) to 90%.

1st grade-ORF from 4.4% (winter benchmark 2021) to 90%

2nd grade-ORF from 5.4% (winter benchmark 2021) to 90%

Increase the percentage of students who are on track or mastered from 25.7% (2018-19) to 30% on TCAP for grades 3-5 ELA in 2022.

2021/2022 J.R. BAKER SCHOOL GOALS

Administrators, teachers, and families have provided input for school-level goals. By analyzing student achievement data, areas of improvement have been targeted.

- ⇒ Increase on track or mastered reading achievement from 26% to 30.6% in 2nd grade, from 22% to 26.9% in 3rd grade, and from 33% to 37.2% in 4th grade.
- ⇒ Increase on track or mastered math achievement from 18% to 23.1% in 2nd grade, from 34% to 38.1% in 3rd grade, and from 39% to 43% in 4th grade.
- ⇒ Reduce chronic unexcused absences by 2%.


2021/2022 STUDENT GOALS
