- → sing the ABC song (in the car, in the bath, while making dinner, make it part of your bedtime routine... as many times as possible!)
- → say the alphabet without singing it (make sure you clearly separate L, M, N, O, P and the ending should be W, X, Y, Z... not X, Y, and Z)

Why Dual Language?

What Foreign Languages Mean for U.S. Employers 9 out of 10 rely on employees with language skills other than English






Dual language programs foster bilingualism, biliteracy, enhanced awareness of linguistic and cultural diversity, and high levels of academic achievement through instruction in two languages.

Many studies have shown that individuals who are exposed to two languages at an early age, on average, outperform their monolingual peers on tests of cognitive function in adolescence and adulthood. English language learners maintain their native language. Learners build strong social connections and cultural awareness.

Research show many cognitive benefits to becoming biliterate.



Dual Language Program Vision

It is our **vision** to cultivate multi-literate learners that see the world through an equitable lens, have a raised awareness of multiculturalism, and can communicate effectively across lines of differences.

Our Dual Language program values the assets of all learners and provides a PreK-12 pathway that is consistent and sustained. We believe that each and every learner can exceed their fullest potential and demonstrate resilience when faced with challenges while **embodying the Mineola Mission of life-long learning, pursuing excellence, developing strength of character and contributing positively to a global society.**

NYS Seal of Biliteracy

The Seal of Biliteracy is a NYS recognition for graduates who have attained a high level of proficiency in English and one or more world languages.

The seal identifies students with language and biliteracy skills for employers & universities... and signifies that students are prepared with 21st century skills to recognize the value of language instruction and to affirm the value of diversity in a multilingual society.

The qualifications include course grades, national and state exams, transcripts, and culminating projects. The NYSSB takes the form of a Seal on the student's diploma and a medallion worn at graduation.



Biliteracy

"Biliteracy is the ability to effectively communicate or understand written thoughts and ideas through the grammatical systems, vocabularies, and written symbols of two different languages."

But what do you mean when you say strategic use of Spanish and English...?

Cognates

Words which have the same linguistic derivation as another; words that are from the same original word or root... i.e. family--familia; special-especial; problem-- problema

Translanguaging

When learners compare and contrast the grammatical structure and sounds of each language to build understanding of the new one.

Language Acquisition

The process of learning a new language!

Oracy

The ability and skills needed to express oneself through speaking.

Bridging Comparing and contrasting features and connections of each language.

i.e. the letter B makes the same sound in English and Spanish

Academic Vocabulary

Words that are used in an academic setting (not always in informal conversation). For example: hypothesis, inference, dividend
