Dear members of the Mineola School Community;

The 2019-2020 Educational Plan and Budget was adopted at the business meeting of the Board of Education on April 16, 2019. We are proud to continue to produce a levy increase at or below 2.5% for the twelfth year in a row. This year's levy is 1.97%. Over the last twelve years we have averaged a levy of 1.71% and a five year average of 1.11% all while increasing programs and opportunities for children. Two of these programs received national attention.

This year Mineola was selected as one of the Most Innovative School Districts in the United States. The title was earned for its creation of new norms for engaging and future-focused learning, based on a complete case study of the district by The School Superintendents Association and Successful Practices Network. Only twenty-five districts in the nation received this designation. In addition, Mineola was featured in the April edition of the Linux Journal for its success in implementing a K-12 computer science curriculum.

The Board of Education and I continue to work diligently in providing financially responsible budgets while maintaining the highest level of educational program. We continue to work toward our goal of containing costs and delivering innovative programs that have an eye on the future.

Estimados miembros de la Comunidad Escolar de Mineola;

El Presupuesto y Plan Educativo 2019-2020 se aprobó en la reunión de trabajo de la Junta de Educación el 16 de abril de 2019. Nos enorgullece seguir produciendo un aumento del gravamen del 2.5% o menor por duodécimo año consecutivo. El gravamen de este año es 1.97%. Durante los últimos doce años tuvimos un promedio del gravamen de 1.71%, y un promedio de cinco años de 1.11%, al mismo tiempo que aumentamos los programas y las oportunidades para los niños. Dos de estos programas recibieron atención nacional.

Este año, Mineola fue seleccionado como uno de los Distritos Escolares Más Innovadores en los Estados Unidos. Se otorgó este título por la creación de nuevas normas para un aprendizaje cautivante y enfocado hacia el futuro, basado en un estudio de caso completo del distrito realizado por la Asociación de Superintendentes Escolares y Red de Prácticas Exitosas. Solo veinticinco distritos en el país recibieron esta designación. Además, se incluyó a Mineola en la edición de abril de Linux Journal por su éxito en la implementación de un plan de estudios de ciencias de la computación K-12.

La Junta de Educación y yo continuamos trabajando diligentemente para proporcionar presupuestos responsables desde el punto de vista financiero, mientras mantenemos el nivel más alto de programa educativo. Continuamos trabajando para lograr nuestro objetivo de contener los costos y brindar programas innovadores que tengan en cuenta el futuro.

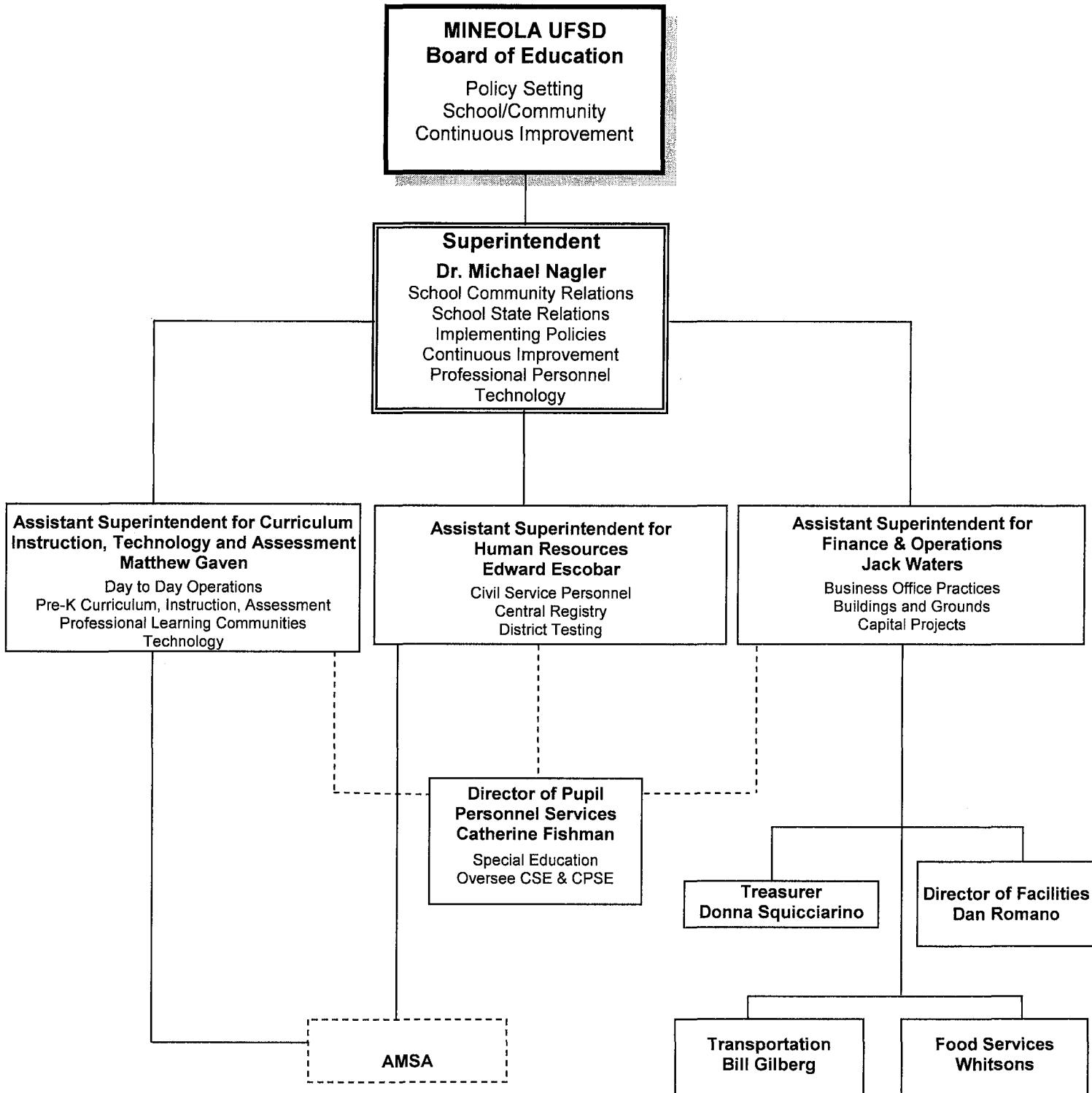

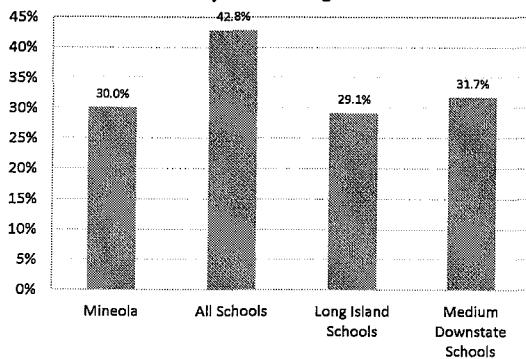

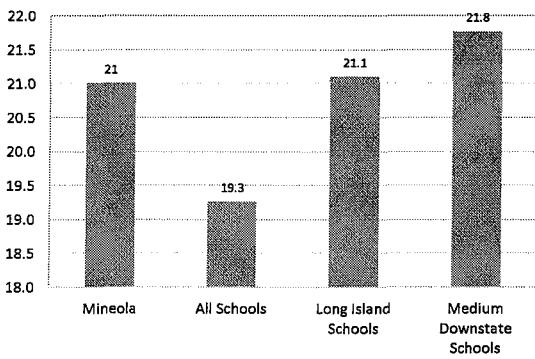
#### Economically Disadvantaged Students

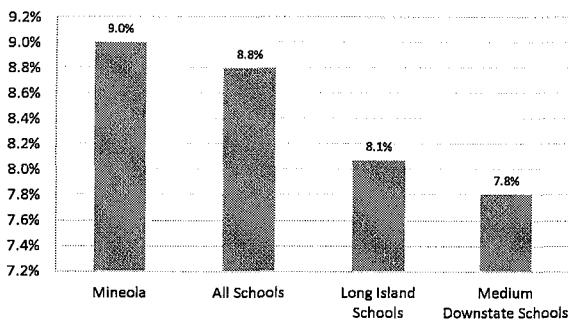
#### Common Branch Class Size

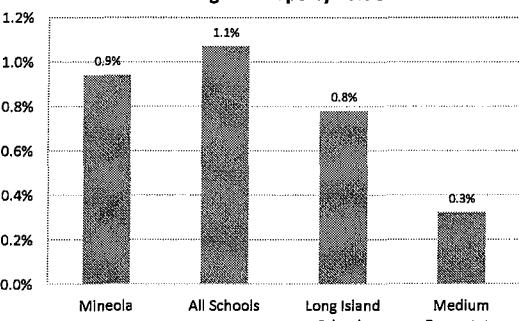
#### Turnover Rate of All Teachers

### ENROLLMENT BY GENDER

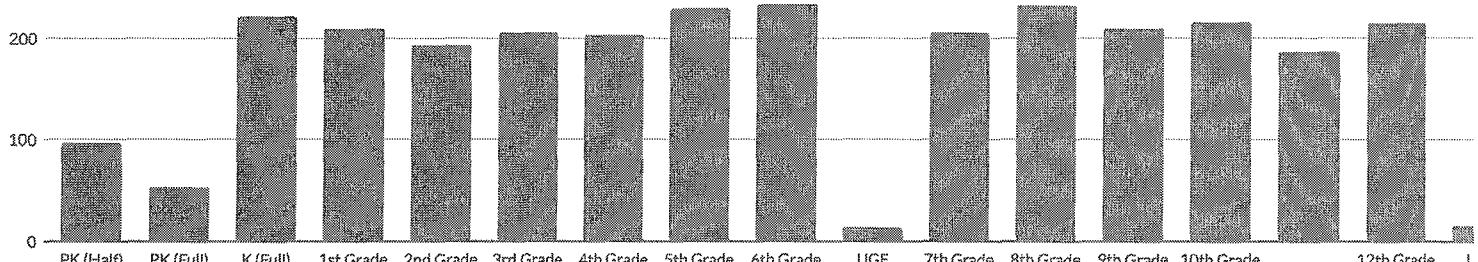

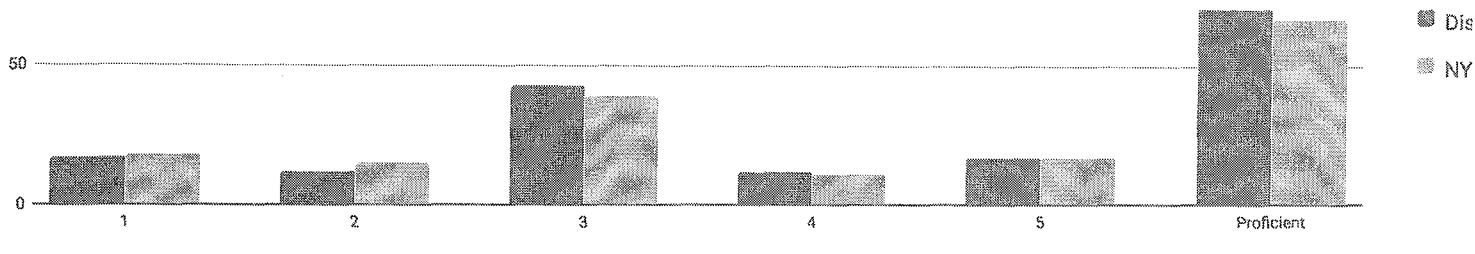

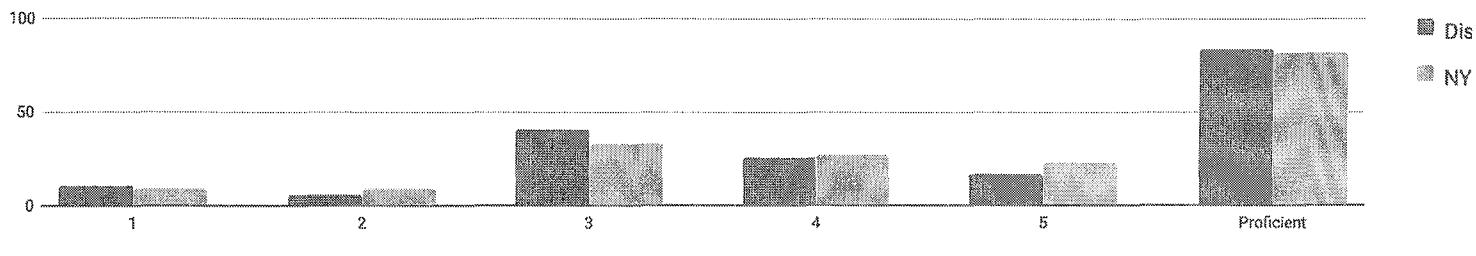

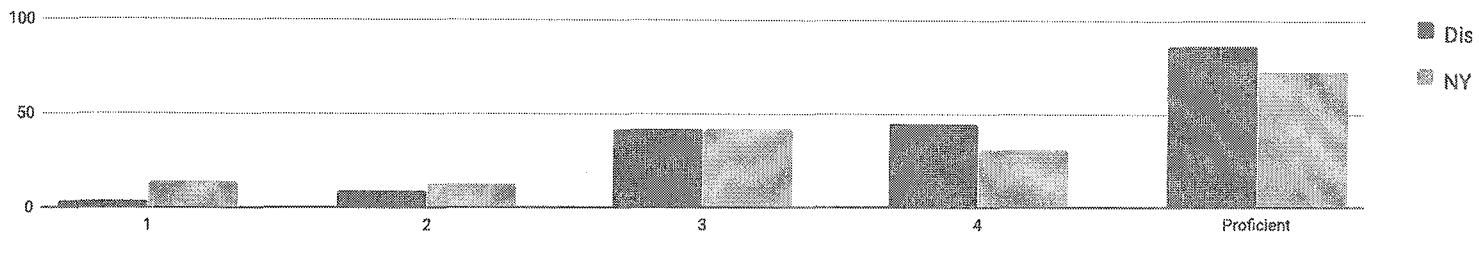
## ANNUAL REGENTS ALGEBRA II (2017-18)

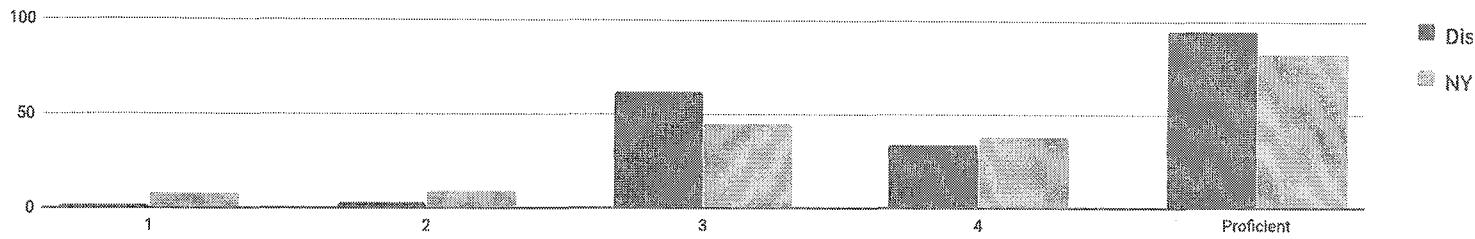

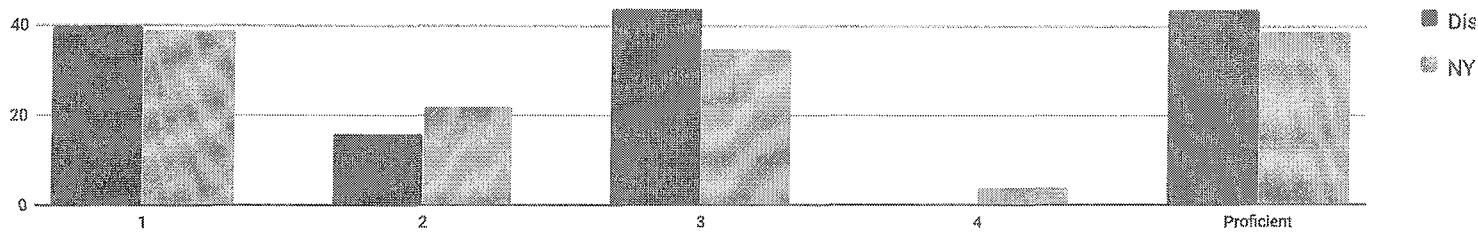

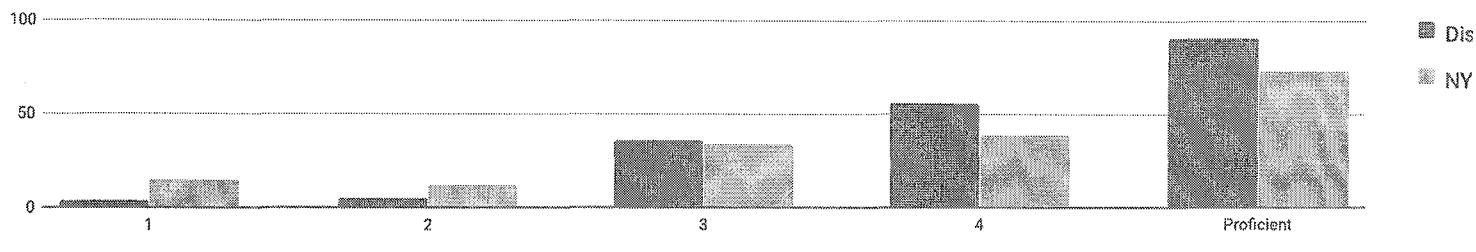

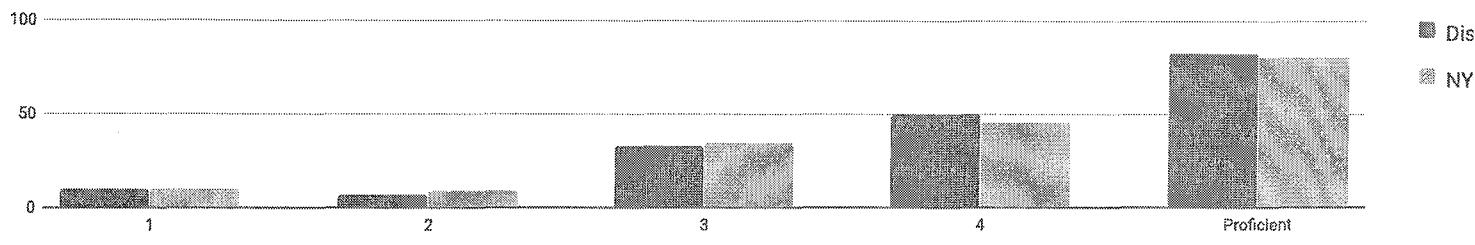
## ANNUAL REGENTS TRANSITION EXAM IN GLOBAL HISTORY &amp; GEOGRAPHY (2017-18)
