NWEA READING MEAN SCORES COMPARED TO NATIONAL MEAN





NWEA READING MEAN SCORES COMPARED TO NATIONAL MEAN





NWEA MATH MEAN SCORES COMPARED TO NATIONAL MEAN





NYS English Language Arts Assessment Results







In 2015, Grade 3 NYS ELA scores were 7 points below Nassau County passing rate. In 2019, 61% of our third graders demonstrated proficiency in ELA. This

brought us within 5 points of the Nassau County proficiency rate.






In 2015, Grade 4 NYS ELA scores were 14 points below Nassau county proficiency rates. In 2019, we surpassed the Nassau County proficiency rate by 3%.

NYS Math Assessment Results







In 2015, Grade 3 NYS Math scores were 13 points below Nassau County passing rate. In 2019, only 54% of our third graders demonstrated proficiency in math-still falling well short of the county proficiency rate.



Percent Demonstrating Proficiency on the NYS Math




