June.





- AP Seminar Students recently completed Performance Task 2 Presentations which included a 2,000-word
 research paper and an 8 min presentation. Student inspiration was grown out of the 2022 Stimulus Material,
 which focused on ritualistic synchrony and explored the role environmental circumstances play in conformity.

- Global 10 Students used Garageband to create Soviet Union Slogan Songs that were designed to represent a marginalized perspective during the Russian Revolution. Students were challenged to explain their rationale for selecting a slow or fast tempo to capture their slogan's energy. Students were also required to justify the instruments used in their song and had to explain how that type of instrument further enhances their slogan's message. For example, using a violin, played at a slow tempo, to create a somber memorial tune.
- In Geometry the classes are completing the "Graph Me a Circle' Art Project. This requires learners to create an illustration of their choosing on a piece of graph paper or on an app of their choosing. In their illustration, learners must include a minimum of six independ circles that they will identify in their work using an appropriate circle equation. No one ever said that learning can't be fun! The Unique Learning System empowers students with complex learning needs to reach their full potential in a learning environment customized just for them. They utilized the ULS to explore Earth Day. The students planted flower seedlings in egg carton gardens while

exploring what environments that plants need to grow. The students then took the new plants home to transplant into pots. The students are continuing their community-based instruction, or authentic practice outside of the school setting with several trips throughout the community.
