Valedictorian and Salutatorian

The district is proud to congratulate Natalie Laszewski and Maya Meola, valedictorian and salutatorian from Mineola High School Class of 2023. Valedictorian is the academic title conferred upon the student with the highest weighted grade point average in each graduating class based upon grade point average. Salutatorian is the student with the second-highest weighted grade point average in the class.

In addition to achieving her status as valedictorian, Natalie was also named AP Scholar with Distinction in spring 2022. As a sophomore and junior, she was accepted to the SUNY Old Westbury Institute of Creative Problem Solving for Gifted and Talented Students, one of the most competitive mathematics programs in the country. Natalie serves as president of the Mineola High School Key Club and Student Service Center, as well as Student Advisory Council member for the Nassau County District Attorney's Office and district intern for Congresswoman Kathleen Rice. She has

been an advocate for female involvement in the golf program, joining the men's varsity team and playing a part in the formation of the school's first woman's team. Natalie plays violin in the String Ensemble and has performed as a soloist at the New York State School Music Association conference and festival.

Maya was named AP Scholar with Honor and Distinction, as well as earned admission to National Honor Society and Science National Honor Society. Her volunteer efforts have included peer tutoring, helping senior citizens with technology as part of the Computeers program and supporting the Student Service Center, the Flag Field of Honor and Athletes Helping Athletes. Maya's extracurricular activities include varsity soccer, track and field, and varsity baseball. She has been the recipient of many sports honors, including the Varsity Girls Basketball Coach's Award and Tri-Athlete Award, and was named captain of the JV girls soccer team.
