The season started with the FIRST Technical Challenge regional competition where our learners clinched the Innovate Award for their design and execution, and secured second place for the Inspire Award, which honors teams that embody the essence of the community and embrace the spirit of collaboration and growth.

At the FIRST Robotics Long Island Regional Competition, the Mineola Wild Reds were proud to accept the FIRST Impact Award, the most prestigious award presented at the competition. This award is testament to the team's transformative and inclusive



culture that prepares learners to be future technology leaders. The team also earned a trip to the World Championships! In the individual category, juniors Julia Manevitz and Matthew Valente were recognized with Dean's List awards, honoring outstanding team leaders who have achieved a high level of technical expertise and accomplishment.
