July 1, 2009

RESOLVED, that the JP Morgan Chase Bank, Bank of America, Capital One, Citibank, The Bank of New York, State Bank of Long Island, Wachovia Bank, TD Bank, HSBC, and Flushing Commercial Bank to be designated as the depositories of the funds of the said District; that current funds of the District be maintained in each of the said depositories; that the said funds shall be subject to withdrawal only in pursuance of a resolution of this Board of Education and on voucher-order checks signed by the Treasurer and Superintendent of Schools or Assistant Superintendent of Finance & Operations, payable to the order of persons entitled to receive such money in accordance with Section 1720 of the Education Law, except however, that pursuant to said Section 1720 one voucher-order check may be drawn in the total amount of a duly certified payroll for the salaries of regular employed employees and officers legally entitled to be compensated for their services. The proceeds of such voucher-order payroll check shall be credited to a Payroll Account, designated as such, in each of the said depositories from which checks shall

be signed by the **Treasurer** of the District and **Assistant Superintendent of Finance & Operations** drawn payable to individual employees or officers legally entitled to be compensated for services only.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Treasurer and Assistant Superintendent of Finance & Operations are hereby further authorized to use either their autographed or facsimile signatures upon such checks to be issued against any or all of the District's accounts provided, however, that such facsimile signatures shall be made by means of a recognized machine or check-signing device to be used for the signing of payroll checks by the Acting Treasurer, which Treasurer cannot be present, with all the safeguards prescribed by the manufacturer, and that the keys for the machine shall at all times be kept in the custody of such officer.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the said depositories be and they (including their correspondent banks) are hereby requested, authorized and directed to honor all checks, drafts or other orders for the payment of money drawn in this corporation's name on its accounts (including those drawn to the individual order of any person or persons whose name(s) appear thereon as a signer or signers thereof) when bearing the facsimile and/or autograph signature of the following:

and said Banks (including their correspondent banks) shall be entitled to honor and to charge this corporation for all such checks, drafts or other orders for the payment of money, regardless of by whom or by what means the actual facsimile signature or signatures thereon may have been affixed thereto, if such facsimile signature or signatures conform to the facsimile specimens from time to time filed with said banks by the Clerk or other officer of this corporation.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that each of the foregoing depositories be designated as depositories for interest-bearing deposits of other funds of said District subject to withdrawal only by appropriate withdrawal orders signed by the Treasurer or Superintendent of Schools or Assistant Superintendent of Finance & Operations and by draft of the depository made payable to the order of this District, which said funds so withdrawn shall be re-deposited by the Treasurer or Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Finance & Operations into established checking accounts of the District as aforesaid provided for current funds.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the said banks are hereby authorized to pay any such checks or drafts and also to receive the same for credit or in payment from the payee or any other holder without inquiring as to the circumstances of issue of the disposition of the proceeds thereof and, except in the case of interest-bearing deposits as in the preceding paragraph provided, even if drawn to the individual order of any signing officer or tendered in payment of his individual obligations.

6. Online Bid Service - Munivest

That the Board of Education authorizes an online bid service, Munivest, in awarding of CD investments to the highest bidder.

7. Board Member & Administrator Liability

That the Board of Education adopts the following Public Officer's Law §18:

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the Mineola Union Free School District hereby adopts the coverage provided by §18 of the New York State Public Officers Law for the following job titles: School Board Trustee, Administrator, employees and agents working for the Mineola UFSD. The adoption of this provision is intended to supplement and not supplant the protection available to such employees by virtue of already existing statutory provisions or other sources. Such coverage shall include but not be limited to being called to testify as a witness or to answer questions concerning their acts or omissions within the scope of their office, agency or employment before a Grand Jury, the Office of the District Attorney, or other law enforcement official. Nothing herein contained shall be construed to authorize or require

defense or indemnification to a member of the board of education, the superintendent of schools, administrator, employee, and/or agent working for the Mineola UFSD who has been identified as a defendant in a pending criminal prosecution, or where such individual or the school district has reason to believe that such individual is a target in a criminal investigation or prosecution by the Office of the District Attorney or other law enforcement entity. This benefit shall not be available to and shall not cover any employee serving in any of the job titles listed herein who is represented for collective bargaining purposes by a duly designated collective bargaining agent unless and until such coverage is negotiated with the collective bargaining agent representing said employee. The Superintendent or his designee shall take steps necessary to obtain insurance protection against the potential liability to the district arising out of the adoption of this provision.

Discussion: Ms. Salvatore inquired about moving the Board of Education meetings to the

High School Auditorium. Dr. Nagler responded that he feels the Auditorium is too big. Mr. McGrath stated that there is no reason to move the meetings to the High School Auditorium because intimacy will be lost. Ms. Salvatore

stated that if there was a conflict with the Auditorium she suggested using the library or cafeteria. Mr. Hornberger stated that the Board has had discussions regarding this topic and the feasibility. There are concerns with the sound system at Willis. He felt the location of Meet the Candidate night was a good venue. Mr. McGrath agreed that Willis' sound system was not adequate. Ms. Salvatore stated that the Board spent \$11,000 on Willis' sound system and it still is not good. She feels it would be cheaper to move the meetings to the High School. Mr. McGrath stated he has not heard from anyone in the audience. Mr. Hale wants to look at the calendar to see if there are conflicts before a decision is made. Mr. Hale feels the sound at Willis is terrible. Mr. McGrath stated the sound is irrelevant to him since he cannot view the meetings on the access channel because he lives outside the Village of Mineola. Ms. Napolitano is also concerned with conflicting dates. Dr. Nagler stated he will check with Syntax regarding conflicting dates and also noted the difficulty in making video presentations at the High School. Mr. Hornberger feels the audience will be more comfortable in the High School Auditorium. Mr. McGrath was concerned that people will get confused. Dr. Nagler stated that in the past Board meetings were rotated between school buildings. Mr. McGrath inquired if other school districts filmed their meetings. Mr. Feldman responded no. Ms. Salvatore inquired about the quality of video of Meet the Candidates Night. Dr. Nagler responded that the cameras were in a fixed position. Dr. Nagler requested discussing this further at the Board's Retreat. The Board concurred to approve the dates, but to table the location pending further discussion.
