As Dr. Nagler stated, we are a school district where most of the time we are celebrating all the good things about our school district but once in a while something happens that effects people so deeply. Ms. Napolitano stated it is a true testament how we respond in those moments almost speaks more about us than when we speak about the good things. What we all saw was we all came together. We are more than a school district, we are a family. We will continue to celebrate Christian's life. He won't be far from anyone's thoughts as we go through the year. He was a senior and there are a lot of things coming up. Just know that we are all here to support the students and the staff. We were very proud of the way the staff just stepped up and did everything without even being told what to do. It came from the heart. We can't ask for anything more from the people who are in charge of the schools. Ms. Napolitano thanked Dr. Nagler and Dr. Smith especially, and his staff. We were so impressed and we will continue to be there for Christian's family and for the students who are his extended family. It's a hard way to start the new year. We will move forward but we won't forget Christian.

# 3. Comments from Superintendent

Dr. Nagler stated that today is the 19th birthday of Christian Melendez who we lost tragically over the winter break. Many of us spent the holiday break trying to make sense of something that makes no sense. The comforting part is the soul of a community is its school system and when tragedy occurs what is the response of the schools. Dr. Nagler stated he is very proud that we supported each other. We came together to try to reconcile the unthinkable loss of a student. We celebrate Christian's life and his impact on our school community and will continue to do that for him, his family and his classmates throughout the year. Dr. Nagler thanked Dr. Smith, the high school principal. Unfortunately, true leaders surface when tragedy occurs and it was evident Dr. Smith is a loved and cherished leader in our community and Dr. Nagler thanked him for really spear heading this effort. The high school administration team, Ms. Fahey, Ms. Marino, Ms. Dvorak were all on hand. Particular thanks to Coach Pereira, Coach Cavalluzzo and Coach Mendez who were on the scene the morning after and have been integral in helping us cope with this; Class advisors Don Leopardi and Gina Buongiovanni in communicating with our seniors; School Psychologists particularly Patricio Romero and Carina Waldman who are both bilingual and incredibly helpful with communicating with our parents; Our social workers Stacey Rosenblatt and John O'Malley at the high school and our School Counselors Frank Azzara, Christine Zarins, Karen McLaughlin and Donna Joyce. It was really the entire staff who gave of their time. We had the school open five or six times over the course of the break to give the students a place to go to make sense of this. Mr. Gaven and Mr. Escobar were constantly present. Booster club and PTSA helped out today. Nassau County Police and Homeland Security helped us have a safe procession to the cemetery today. He thanked Mayor Strauss and the fire department, and the trustees that attended today to pay their respects. Dr. Nagler stated that Mineola is a special place. It never ceases to amaze him how we all come together. The empathy we have for one another is what school is supposed to be about. Learning is important but everything else is more important. When terrible things happen, we showcase why we are special. Dr. Nagler is proud of this and he thanked everyone involved. He sends his deep condolences to the Melendez Family. Paul Pereira is doing a fundraiser selling tee shirts. The proceeds will go to the Melendez family and to start a scholarship in Christian's name.

Dr. Nagler gave an update on the capital projects. Over the break we received some steel for Hampton Street

and the framework is up for the new cafeteria. We had a steam leak that needed a repair. Dr. Nagler thanked Pancho for being there every day to clean up the mess. Our energy performance contract was approved by the state and we will begin work on converting all of our steam heat to hot water which is a big undertaking in Hampton, Jackson and the middle school. These are the 3 buildings with steam.
