Reported COVID Numbers (*will be reported if case numbers >20)

- 48 positive cases reported to the Mountain Brook School system this week
- 69 individuals designated as close contact by the 3 foot, 15-minute criteria from the ADPH
- 24 of the 69 close contact individuals were able to return to school due to full vaccination status and did not display symptoms
