- End with a hook or cliff hanger to get your classmates interested. (1 sentence)
- Would you recommend this book? Why? (1 sentence)
- Where can we find the book? (1 sentence)
- Don't forget your name!

Book Buzz about a Non-fiction book: Should include. . . .

- Tell the title and author (1 sentence)
- Tell the genre (type of book; 1 sentence, or you can combine with another sentence)
- Describe the subject (what is this book about; 1 sentence)
- Give the audience just a glimpse into the book by telling 3-4 important facts or events. (3-4 sentences)
- End with a hook or cliffhanger to get your classmates interested. (1 sentence)
- Would you recommend this book?
 Why? (1 sentence)
- Where can we find the book? (1 sentence)

Fiction Book Buzz Example:
