

2015-2016 Course Selection Timeline

January 20 - January 30

Curriculum information will be presented in English and US History classes.

Wednesday, January 28

Grade 9 parent and student meeting for career, college, and curriculum information night.

Friday, February 6

Course selection sheets and any applications (JELCC, Early Release, etc.) due in Period 3 and signed by parents.

Beginning in February, counselors will meet with students individually to plan courses that meet career and educational goals expressed by the student. Any adjustments in courses previously selected by parents and students will be made at that time. In May, students will receive a list of courses they have requested. Students will be allowed to make any changes by returning the course requests at that time. After that time, requests for changes will not be allowed, except for semester failures and classes taken during summer school.

Parents and students are asked to give careful attention to the classes requested this spring. Student requests determine the school's master schedule and staffing needs and fees are not adjusted for drop/add. Parents are encouraged to contact the assigned counselor for information or make an appointment to discuss these important decisions.

Finding College Scholarships

The greatest amount of scholarship dollars are awarded by colleges and universities when students apply for admission, but there are thousands of scholarships available through sites like:

You will receive ongoing email notifications of scholarships tailored to your interests when you register with these sites.

You will also find scholarship information lists and applications in the Guidance Office, as well as on the Naviance site. Information is updated regularly.

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

FAFSA is used by college and university financial aid offices to determine eligibility for grants, low-interest loans, college work-study programs and sometimes scholarships. Indiana colleges generally require the form to be filed by March 10 of the senior year, but some out-of-state colleges have earlier deadlines. Be sure to check the priority date for your schools of interest. Applying after deadlines could mean loss of funds.

Filing Tips:

- Seniors and parents can request PIN's now (www.pin.ed.gov).
- Complete your tax forms early, you'll need them to file.
- File online: <u>www.fafsa.ed.gov</u>
- Read and follow the instructions.
- Print a copy for your college files.

Student Appointment Procedure

On the morning of an appointment, parents or guardians must place a call to the attendance office stating that an appointment is scheduled for the student. (Notes will not be accepted.) It becomes the *student's responsibility* to pick up the green pass from the attendance office. The student can pick up the green pass during passing periods or during his/her lunch period. It is *not* school policy to interrupt class time. When the student acquires the green pass, s/he may leave the building to meet the parent or guardian for the appointment, usually at door #1. Please, make sure this information is communicated between the student and parent or guardian on the day of the appointment. The student should bring proof of appointment and return to the attendance office. This information can be found on page 101 of the <u>Student Calendar and Handbook</u>. Call the attendance Office phone number: 259-5355, ext. 45556, and leave a detailed message of absence or scheduled doctor's appointment.
