

#### 2016 AP EXAM REGISTRATION

Students enrolled in AP courses are expected to sit for AP exams in May. Students should register and pay fees for AP tests online between **February 16** - **March 9**.

Should students need to register late for <u>ANY</u> reason, they may do so March 10-17 for an additional \$50.00 PER TEST IN ADDITION TO THE STANDARD TEST FEE. <u>Scholarships will be forfeited if the registration is late</u>. All tests are \$96 or \$15 depending on the subject matter. Students who qualify for free and reduced lunch will have their exams paid for so they should check the appropriate box when registering online. Scholarships are available to students who are not on free and reduced lunch but have a financial need. Students may apply for the scholarship online as well. Funds are limited so students are encouraged to apply early. Students will register for exams at www.TotalRegistration.net/AP/151717.

NO REGISTRATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER MARCH 10 WITHOUT A \$50 ADDITIONAL FEE PER TEST. NO EXCEPTIONS!





# North Central High School Alumni Hall of Fame Inductees

In 1991, North Central High School established an Alumni Hall of Fame to recognize graduates for their professional achievements and personal contributions to improve the lives of others and society. Hall of Fame inductees come from all walks of life: armed services, athletics, business, education, fine arts, government, law, literature, media, medicine, performing arts, and/or science. Since the inception of the program, 101 proud alumni have been inducted into the Hall of Fame and prominently displayed in the halls of North Central. Their examples of leadership, service and success offer an inspiration to our thousands of current students.



### Steve Campbell 1988

Mr. Campbell has been awarded the Sagamore of Wabash, Indiana's highest civilian award in 1997, 2000, and 2005. He is President Communications for The Mind Trust (advancing K-12 education in Indianapolis). Mr. Campbell is an Adjunct Faculty member at Indiana University Purdue University -Indianapolis (IUPUI). He is Marion County Coordinator for the Indiana Bicentennial Commission.




### James P. Jontz 1970 (deceased)

Three-term US Congressman representing Indiana's District from 1986 to 1992: indefatigable advocate Hoosiers, veterans, the elderly and the environment. At age 22, the second youngest person elected to the Indiana House of Representatives, serving terms; President of Americans for Democratic Action 1998 to 2000; founder of Working Families Win, educating voters about political candidates' economic positions. Mr. Jontz was an Eagle Scout. Mr. Jontz is described as one of the most incredibly hardworking and gifted natural politicians who routinely did the impossible.
