#### Class Schedules

#### ALL GRADE LEVELS: Concerned About College Costs?

NC families are eligible to receive FREE personalized advice on making college affordable through the **National Center for College Costs (NCCC).** An NCCC representative will be available at **Back-to-School Night** on **Monday, August 22,** to answer questions about paying for college and to explain their college cost estimator. A **follow-up workshop will be held on Tuesday, November 15,** at which time individualized reports will be returned to families explaining the awarding of all types of aid as it relates to personal financial profiles. There is a financial planning charge of \$5 to all freshmen to become client families of the NCCC (included in general fees). #### Register with NAVIANCE

North Central Guidance encourages all students to register with NAVIANCE Family Connection, a free internet-based college search, comparison and application program. Juniors and seniors will find it the most helpful, but freshmen and sophomores can use it to begin their college planning, career exploration and to begin building resumes.

#### Using NAVIANCE requires:

- Current e-mail address (please notify the Guidance Office of new e-mail addresses)
- Registration code, which will be e-mailed to students (also available in the Guidance Office)
- Once you have your registration code, register at http://connection.naviance.com/northcentral
   as a
   new user on the upper right side of the screen.

**Sign Up for College Meetings:** Juniors and seniors will use the program to sign up for meetings with college representatives visiting North Central in the fall. Just log in, click on the 'College' tab, and then click on 'view all upcoming college visits' on the right. As the visits are scheduled, they will appear under 'College Visits.'

The Personal Project is a student-directed investigation into a topic of personal interest. Involving a

cycle of inquiry, action, and reflection, the Personal Project allows students to demonstrate the academic skills learned and learner profile attributes developed over the course of the five-year Middle Years Program (grades 6-10).

The key pieces of the personal project are the process journal documenting students' process and progress over the course of their project, a final report and an exhibition during which students display and discuss the final product/outcome they have created. Both the process journal and the report can be completed in writing, as an audio entry or even as a film.

This year each tenth grade student will be assigned a supervisor. Supervisors will be faculty from NCHS as well as administration from CEC. The role of the supervisor is to help students as they move through the process of completing a project that is based solely on each student's **personal** interest. Based on the pilots we have run during the past two years, these interests range from nature photography to creating a basketball team with a group of elementary school students.

If a student has a project that requires an expert in a particular field, that expert would be considered the student's mentor. Mentors are individuals in the community who have the expertise the student needs and who are willing to offer their time in helping students pursue their interests. If you have a particular skill or interest, please feel free to contact Julie Barthel (<a href="mailto:jbarthel@msdwt.k12.in.us">jbarthel@msdwt.k12.in.us</a>) and let her know of your wiliness to help. We here at NCHS are very excited to see what our students can achieve given the opportunity to investigate a personal interest and given the opportunity to produce a final project based on their investigations.
