From the Principal . . .

In February and March 2017, several opportunities were offered to attend the State of Washington Township Schools Presentation at ten different locations throughout the District. If you were unable to attend a meeting, or if you attended and would like to review the information, it is being provided in video format. In the video, you will be able to see the information that was presented as well as give feedback on the topics covered using the survey link below.

Due to the future opening of an 8th elementary school, as well as the need to maintain better enrollment size balance among our three middle schools, the District must rebalance attendance boundaries or "zones" for K-8 schools. This will be a comprehensive process over the next 12-18 months, with implementation possible at the start of the 2019-2020 school year. The District is currently gathering feedback from all MSDWT stakeholders during the early stages of establishing these attendance zones. Additionally, we will be using feedback from this survey to guide our discussions regarding the start and end times of our school day at all Elementary, Middle and High School levels.

Please complete the survey to provide your feedback and input in this important decision-making process. Your responses will be very helpful as consideration is given to attendance boundary options as well as potential changes to the school day start and end times.

COLLEGE BOOT CAMP

June 1 & 2 8:30 am - 5:30 pm Cost: \$100

Students who will be seniors in the fall of 2017 are eligible to apply

for this workshop. Learn how to maximize the college search process, research college resources online, define personal criteria for a good college fit and create a resume for admission and scholarship applications. English teachers and college admissions reps will work with students on developing their college admission essays, and the dean of a selective college will coach students on what competitive schools are looking for from their applicants. Applications for the workshop will be available in the Guidance Office beginning Friday, April 14. Space is limited.

THE COLLEGE HANDBOOK

Juniors received this handbook at Junior Night or in homeroom in March/April. The College Handbook fully outlines NCHS's college search and application process. Keep it handy and refer to it throughout the process. It's an essential resource for juniors and seniors! See your counselor if you haven't received yours.

JUNIORS APPLY TO COLLEGE EARLY

Colleges generally have their online applications for admission available over the summer – usually around mid-July. The Common Application goes live August 1, but you can begin working on it now and "rollover" the information in August. See their website for instructions on how to do that. Your guidance counselor will need some North Central forms from you, illustrated on pages 21-29 of The College Handbook. Counselors will begin accepting these forms on Friday, August 18.

ELECTRONIC TRANSCRIPTS

SENIORS: Make sure your final high school transcript get to the college of your choice! Log-in to your Parchment account and request your transcript to be sent once final grades are posted. If you have not set up a Parchment account, go www.parchment.com and select the college you will be attending.

Minimum Requirements for School Entry for 2017-2018

- 3 Hep B
- 5 DTAP
- 4 Polio
- 2 MMR
- 2 Varicella
- 1 Tdap (Tetanus & Pertussis)
- 1 MCV4 (Meningococcal)
- 2 Hep A*
- * For grades 4-12, two doses of Hep A are recommended.

Grade 12

- 3 Hep B
- 5 DTAP
- 4 Polio
- 2 MMR
- 2 Varicella
- 1 Tdap (Tetanus & Pertussis)
- 2 Hep A**
- 2 MCV4 (Meningococcal)*
- MenB (Meningococcal B)**
- * For grade 12, two doses of MCV4 are required
- **For grade 12, two doses of Hep A and two doses of MenB are *recommended*.

All doses must be <u>valid</u> doses. Live vaccines may be administered on the same day but must be at least 28 days apart if given on different days. Vaccines must be administered at the intervals determined by CDC guidelines to be considered valid. If you have any questions, please contact your student's healthcare provider, Marion County Health Department or Nicole Cooper, Supervisor of Health Services MSDWT.
