COLLEGE CAMPUS VISITS

Students are strongly encouraged to visit colleges of interest before deciding to enroll. Visits should be made prior to **May 1**, the National Candidate Reply Date, when college enrollment deposits are due. Juniors and Seniors are entitled to 2 excused absences per school year for college visits, but visits can also be made on Saturdays and when North Central is not in session.

Procedure for excused absences:

- ⇒ Pick up the green <u>College Campus Visit Form</u> in the Attendance Office.
- ⇒ Get signatures on the form from your parents, Mrs. Payne and all of your teachers.
- ⇒ Have a parent notify the Attendance Office **prior to your visit.**
- Obtain a letter from the admissions office on official letterhead verifying your visit (the date of your visit and with whom).
- ⇒ Return the green form and letter to the Attendance Office the following day. Both documents must be received for the college visit to be considered an excused absence.

The FAFSA & CSS PROFILE

These are the two forms requested by colleges to determine your eligibility for financial assistance. Check with each college on your list for their deadlines.

FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) – All colleges request that you complete this form to determine your eligibility for financial aid. File online at www.fafsa.ed.gov

CSS PROFILE – Some colleges, mostly private, will want you to fill this out IN ADDITION to the FAFSA. It can be found on College Board's website at https://cssprofile.collegeboard.org/

APPLYING TO COLLEGE

Processing forms are available outside Mrs. Stroke's office and on the south wall of the Guidance Office – near the flag. Mrs. Stroke gets your Pink Sheets, while your counselor gets your Yellow Sheet. Allow at least TWO WEEKS for your counselor to process your materials.

- PINK SHEET Submit one for EACH college application, with a parent/guardian signature on the first one. There is a \$1 processing fee for each Pink Sheet.
- YELLOW SHEET Counselor Recommendation Worksheet/Student Information Sheet. You can turn in a resume with the Counselor Recommendation in lieu of completing the information sheet.
- GREEN SHEET Teacher Recommendation Worksheet. Give this to teachers who have agreed to write letters of recommendation for you.
- TRANSCRIPTS If you are applying through the Common Application, your counselor will upload your transcript. Otherwise, request your transcript through www.parchment.com.



MIDDLE YEARS PROGRAM



A team from International Baccalaureate (IB) is slated to return to our district in the fall of 2019 to assess where we are in terms of compliance with the Middle Years Program (MYP). As a result, next year is a big year for MYP as we must engage in a "self-study" assessment in order to gather the information IB requires and in order to ensure that we are fully and

truly implementing IB practices. These practices range from inquiry-based classroom strategies to conceptual understanding that includes both problem posing and problem solving. Work is already underway in order to achieve the highest numbers on the IB rubrics provided to us.

Unlike the self study for which work is just beginning, the 2016-2017 Personal Project is fully underway. We have completed our second all-school meeting with sophomores. The Personal Project is a year-long project directed by the students' own interests and supervised by teaching or administrative staff. The final product/ outcome will be presented by the students during the April exhibition; there students will display and discuss what they have created

During a recent tenth-grade homeroom, I asked sophomores what their plans were for their projects. One girl told me she is teaching herself the ukulele, another described her YouTube video that will provide hair tutorials. A boy described the Italian three-course meal that he is working to create while another boy told me of the music he is composing for the album he hopes to produce. And then of course, there is the horror movie that is in the works! I know I am not alone in looking forward to seeing what our tenth graders can create, achieve and develop once they are allowed the time to explore something in which they are interested. This years' projects promise to be just as exciting as last year's projects.
