General Department Information

BAND, CHOIR, and ORCHESTRA

All freshmen band, choir, and orchestra students typically will be placed in Concert Winds (band) Concert Orchestra (orchestra), Allegros (female chorus), or Ambassadors (male chorus).

All current North Central students and incoming 9th grade students (Band, Orchestra, Choir, and Repertory Theatre) will undergo an audition process early in the second semester. Specific audition times and locations will be arranged with the middle school directors. Rosters will be determined by spring break and shared with all middle school and high school counselors to help facilitate scheduling. Students new to MSDWT should contact the Performing Arts Department to schedule an audition. Special Note: There will be a small number of grade 9 students that make it into an advanced ensemble. These students will be listed on the Performing Arts rosters when they are released.

THEATRE

There are no prerequisites for Theatre Arts I. Students may enroll in Intro to Technical Theatre beginning their sophomore year with no prerequisites.

JAZZ

Any incoming 9th grade student wishing to be in a jazz group (Jazz Ensemble or Jazz Lab Band) will need to participate in the All-Star Middle School Jazz Band in the spring semester. Interested students should see their middle school director for information by the beginning of March. Mr. Granlund or Mr. Brinkman will circulate this information accordingly.

Special Note: Any student wishing to be involved with the either the Jazz Ensemble or Jazz Lab band must be concurrently enrolled in a concert band class (Concert Winds, Symphonic Band, or Wind Ensemble) on their primary instrument. Only in rare cases will an exception be granted.

BEGINNING BAND/ORCHESTRA

Students will learn to play either a woodwind, brass, or string instrument (percussion not available for this course). This course serves as a prep course for the Band and Orchestra program. Register only with permission of the instructor.

* Student must own their own instructor approved instrument. Instruments and/or supplies will not be provided

MARCHING BAND & DANCE TEAM

Students enrolled in the Marching Band or Pantherettes will receive one credit basic Physical Education. The school requires one of the two mandated Physical Education credits to come from taking the Physical Education class, but this fulfills the other obligation. This gives the student room in their schedule during the school year to take other electives.
