





Survey of Likely 2020 Voters Re: Potential Bond Measure Mill Valley School District

Summary of Results - November 14, 2019

# Methodology



- Hybrid telephone and web survey of likely 2020 voters
  - Updated methodology approach from past surveys\*
  - Voters were contacted for phone interviews via landline and cell phone, and invited to complete a web version of the survey via an email invitation or a text message invitation
- Survey data has been weighted to reflect a Likely March 2020 electorate
- Conducted October 7-17, 2019
- 409 completed interviews
- Overall margin of error ±4.9 percentage points

Please note that due to rounding, some percentages may not add up to exactly 100%.

# **Key Findings**



- Mill Valley School District is viewed positively by voters.
- A majority of voters perceive at least some need for additional money in the District, but this perception lacks intensity.
- Voters believe that the elementary school facilities and the middle school facilities are generally in good physical condition.
- Support today for a bond measure tested below the 55% threshold required to pass.
- Additional information about what the bond measure would do increases support with voters prioritizing projects that address basic repairs and school safety and security.
- Opposition messaging could also have an impact on support.



# **Opinions of MVSD**




Most voters have a positive view of the District, particularly the quality of education.



# **Opinions of MVSD Facilities**




The majority think that Mill Valley School District schools are in good physical condition, with slightly less positive perceptions about the middle school facilities.

### Awareness of the need for funding is low.



While four in five agree that high-quality schools are worth increased taxes, more than one-third say they would not vote for a tax increase for any purpose.






## **Potential Bond Measure**

## Initial Vote for Potential Bond Measure



Support today for a potential bond measure falls short of the 55% threshold required to pass.


To update all Mill Valley elementary schools and reconstruct and modernize Mill Valley Middle School; update classrooms and labs for current learning; upgrade technology; improve school safety with security and seismic updates; and construct, repair, and equip facilities/sites/classrooms, shall Mill Valley School District issue \$120,000,000 in bonds at legal rates, raising approximately \$8,000,000 annually while bonds are outstanding at an estimated \$30/\$100,000 of assessed valuation, with taxpayer oversight, audits, and no money for administrators?

Voters prioritize projects that support general maintenance and school safety and security.




# **Potential Bond Projects**

### Other potential projects are also important but with less intensity.



## **Additional Information**



Fiscal accountability provisions, maintaining local property values, the cost of the bond being potentially offset by an expiring parcel tax, and safety and security upgrades are compelling reasons to support a bond measure.


Our local schools are doing a great job educating our children. We have high test scores, excellent teachers and staff, and strong parent support. With this measure, we will continue to improve our facilities so our schools can maintain and improve the quality of education our children receive.

The reconstructed middle school will be built according to the highest environmental standards.

The way kids were taught was very different when Mill Valley Middle School was built. Times have changed and simply making repairs to our classrooms and science labs won't be enough to allow for current learning in our schools. Reconstructing the middle school will provide classrooms and science labs that meet today's educational standards.

Mill Valley Middle School was built in 1972 and keeping the current building running would take millions of dollars in ongoing maintenance projects. Replacing the school makes more sense—we'll get all the benefits of the upgrades at once, and it will save the District and taxpayers millions of dollars in the long term.




Additional information increases support for the measure.

Potential opposition statements are compelling to a significant percentage of voters.



## **Conclusions & Recommendations**



- Opinions of the District continue to be positive; however, willingness to invest in District facilities is relatively low.
- A bond measure for local elementary schools and the middle school appears challenging but, in the right environment, could be feasible.
- Increasing awareness of facility needs will be important.
- Communicating the school safety and security improvements and strong fiscal accountability provisions included in a bond measure, and the community benefits of investing in local schools is recommended.
- A robust, privately funded campaign effort would be needed to ensure voters understand the need for, and benefits of, a measure.



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
