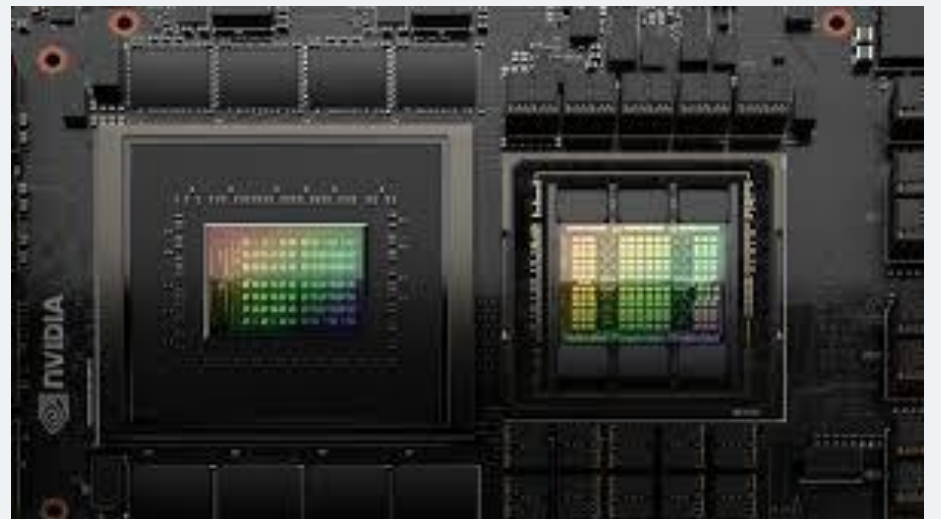


Ms. Shriner digging into one of her favorites, *On The Road*. Photo by Ryan McKillip

Some advice she has for the incoming freshman is, “I would say to always be good friends with yourself; you won’t mind being alone because you’ll like your own company.”

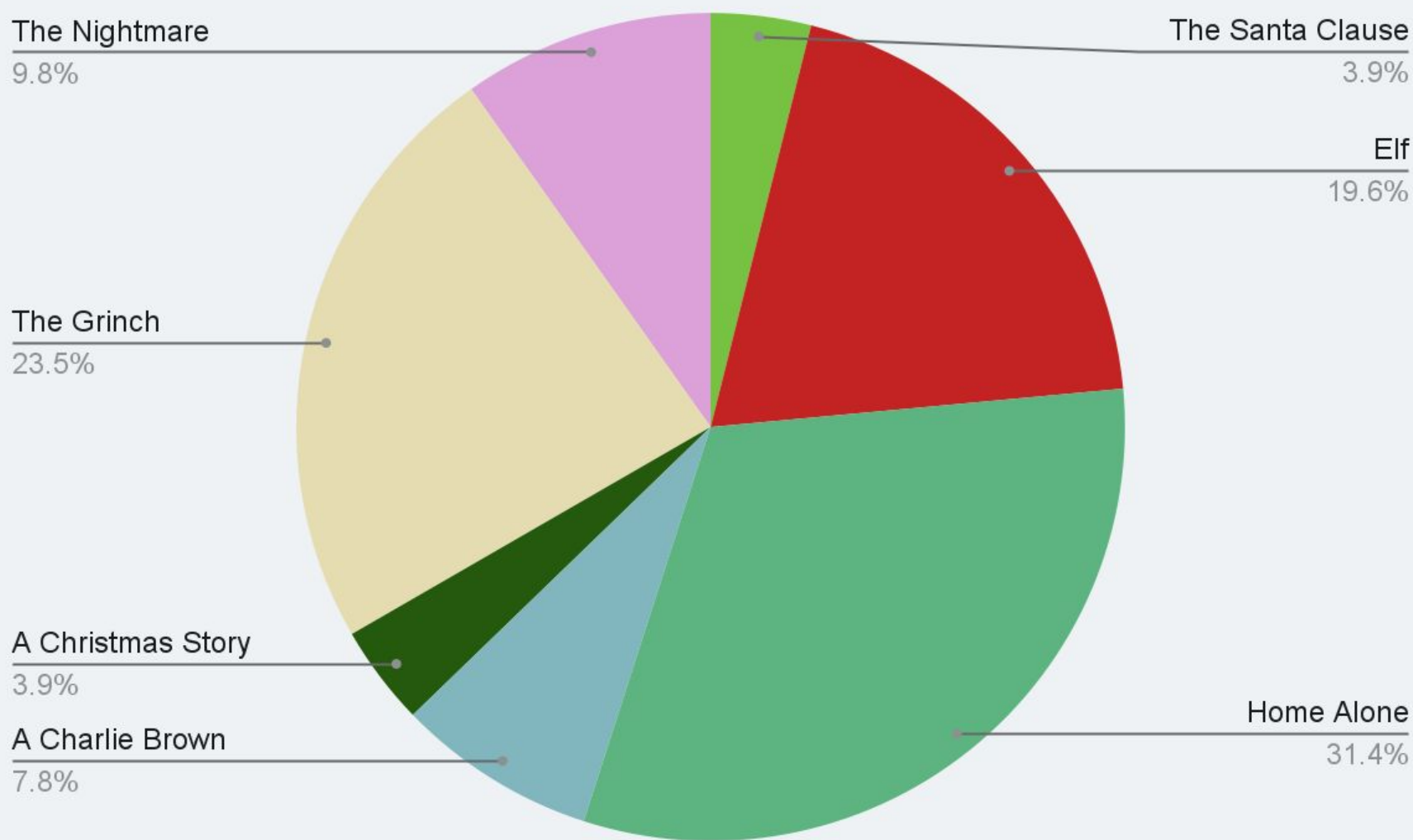
What she is looking forward to after graduation is getting a cool, maybe a little junky car, fixing it when it breaks, and just driving around. “zoom-zoom”.
