- Superintendent Wharton reports that we now are eligible for an additional ODE grant to support schools during COVID-19 and CDL.

• NVASI: This week, NVASI emailed a schematic design. They will be present for the September 2020 board meeting with more details.

# **BOND/FACILITIES-**

The recent wind storm and wildfires halted our work on the K-8 project. Today work has returned to normal. Drywall is beginning to be installed in the renovated existing school. The water system components will be shipped by the manufacturer this week, the playground equipment will be set, and work will continue on the new drain field.

The high school seismic project in is the final two weeks of work.

FALL 2020- This week each our our registered students will have a scheduled conference with their teacher. The last two weeks staff have been participating in professional development that has helped to expand their online instructional skills. The district will be utilizing CANVAS as our leaning management system and supplementing our state approved adopted curriculum with Acellus. Students will begin engaging with their teachers, daily, on September 21, 2020.

**NVASI-** The schematic design for the NVASi proposed Community Park has been completed. At the October 2020 board meeting the NVASi board will present the schematic design to the board of directors.

**FOOD SERVICE-** Families are now accessing the free food service for 1yr olds-18 year children living in our region. To sign up families visit our website. We are currently serving 240 students and that number will continue to grow.

## **Upcoming Activities:**

- Parent Teacher conferences are scheduled to begin this Wednesday. Teachers are reaching out to parents to get those scheduled.
- Device pick up is happening up here the first part of this week.
- Textbooks will be delivered next week.

#### Recent Activities:

- Online Registration is complete, and thanks to Tami and Barb chasing down some parents, we have every one accounted for. This was a new process for our community, so there was a learning curve. I am confident that we will be able to smooth out the process next year.
- We had several families that have chose to homeschool or do online school with their students until we are back face to face, but we had more new students than those that withdrew. At the Jr Sr. High, we have 231 students enrolled in seventh grade through twelfth.
- Seismic Retrofit continues on and the gym floor looks great! It will be a changed school when we do get students back in the building.

## Transportation:

- Our new buses were delivered last week, and our new van will be delivered next month. We will start the process for getting rid of a few buses that are no longer in use.
- Food delivery started this past week, and seems to be going pretty well.

2020 seems to keep throwing challenges our way. The current situation with the wind storms and fires have directly impacted staff in the District and at the Elementary. I am in communication with my impacted staff and they and their families are safe and cared for. Further, in spite of the challenges we all are facing the staff is continuing forward with their learning and preparation for the beginning of distance learning. The staff is remarkably adaptable and tenacious in their work.

One of the highlights of the last couple of weeks is having staff physically present in spite of the social distancing and other precautions in place for COVID-19. Their presence and proximity has been a morale boost for them and me. It has also helped them to learn and prepare collaboratively for this coming year.

Teachers learning and collaboration has centered on the Learning Management System – Canvas which we will be using this year. Canvas should prove to be a valuable tool for the district going forward. Thanks go to Robin Richwine for all of her work on this tool. Also, staff has been working on the learning platforms Seesaw and Google Classroom. I am excited to see the teachers work with our families to implement these different tools to provide Comprehensive Distance Learning. (CDL)

I am glad to have the following new staff come on board, Johns Sousa 3<sup>rd</sup> grade, Jenni Green 1<sup>st</sup> grade and Sharmen Ensminger Counselor. Each of these individuals is already proving themselves to be valuable members of the team. I look forward to working with them for many years. Additionally, we have the new to us staff at Nestucca Valley Early Learning Center whom I am sure you know.

As I have said before I am very thankful to be here during times like this and with the knowledge that my colleagues and community look out for and take care of each other.
