I cannot thank you all enough for the support and enthusiasm you have shown in passing our school bond to renovate and construct a K-8 campus for our children. We are so fortunate to have such a supporting community, and are excited to take on this work for the future of our district.

WHAT YOU CAN EXPECT IN THE FIRST YEAR-

From now, until approximately May of 2019, the district will enter into the "planning" stages of our renovation and construction of the elementary campus. This will be a collaborative process, with community members participating, in both the Bond Oversight Committee and the Design Team. There will not be many visible signs of progress until we begin to move the earth around in the Spring of 2019. In an effort to keep you as informed as you would like to, we will be regularly updating our bond tab on the NVSD website, under the facilities tab.

This summer we will be preparing the NVSD portfolio for the sale of our bonds and completing all of the prescribed requirements to access our \$4 million grant.

This work, renovating and constructing a K-8 facility, is a very large undertaking for our district. We are so thankful for the opportunity to expand the offerings for our students! Thank you Nestucca Valley School District community!

This school year we will be saying goodbye to four longtime NVSD employees. Many of you in the community may have attended school, while these individuals worked to make school a great place for you. Teri Butler, Jose Hernandez, Mary Groves and Sherri Finnel will all be retiring this year. If we were to add up all of their years of service, it would total over 100 years. Think of all of the students' lives that these professionals have had an impact upon. They will be missed!

What a Whirlwind of a Year!

This has been a fun-filled, exciting, sometimes a little crazy, but never boring year. I consider it a privilege to get to work with your kids, and have enjoyed my time as their principal.

I wanted to let you know that we will have a Summer School program going on for students who need to make up some credits to get back on track for graduation, or want to become eligible to play sports. Our summer school session will begin July 30th and will run through August 16th, Monday through Thursday from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. Transportation will be provided by the school district, as will lunch. We will have specific plans set up geared to help each individual get the most of the time that he or she possibly can. Registration for next year will be August 13th through the 15th. The first two days will be from 1:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m., and the last day will be from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. We are also working on providing Online Registration. If you don't have a ParentVue account, please contact Robin at (503) 392-3194 x100 to set one up. ParentVue is also a great way to keep track of your child's grades, attendance, behavior, etc.

Again, I have had a lot of fun with your children this year. I do look forward to summer, as we all do, but I also look forward to the next year. I get excited about improvements to make and watching the kids get involved in activities. Kids who are involved in any extracurricular activity in school (clubs, drama, music, speech or sports), as a general rule, are 20% more likely to have a better grades higher test scores than those students who don't participate in an extracurricular activity. Students who are involved in activities outside of school are also 22% more like to earn a Bachelor's degree or higher. Knowing these statistics, I encourage your kids to get involved. We are a small community. By getting involved, they become part of another family and make friends and have the support of a whole other group of individuals. They meet youth from other schools and make possible lifelong friends. We have many opportunities for our kids, but for now...have a great summer!


Thank You For All of Your Hard Work and Dedication!

Nestucca Junior High Choir performed outstandingly well at the District 3 Middle School Choir Festival. This festival is a non—competitive but scored event.

The students were commended on their "nice tone," "engaged faces" and "professional look and on-stage demeanor" by the judge, Steve Peter, who did a brief workshop with them after the performance.

Mrs. Serven is really pleased with how the students did, especially regarding their improvement. She emphasized to the group that music performance at festival is not about "beating another group" but rather for sharing quality music performances and for self-improvement, both as individual musicians and as a performing group. Last year's score was

excellent, at an 80, and they improved to 89 this year, something they can be very proud of.

To receive the positive comment about facial expression while performing is actually something we have worked hard on, from grades 7-12, chorally. Receiving that positive comment was a first, and that, along with good tone and professionalism, is a good achievement and recognition of a high standard of performance, which is our ultimate goal.

Nestucca Jr/Sr High Spring Concert went very well. The special feature was a full screen film created and timed by Mrs. Serven's husband, to go along with the HS Band's performance of Gustav Holst's

"Themes from The

Planets"--while the gym went dark, students used stand lights to perform the celestial piece. All four of our performing groups did very well that night!

Music a'la Carte took place just one week after the Spring Concert, and performers were excellent. They included several good singers, a song-writer (Aiden Jenema) who performed his own piece with vocals and guitar, and a hilarious skit performed by Mariah Hallock and Co. The show was MC'd by junior lan Anderson and senior Mariah Hallock. Mrs. Serven has made plans with Mr. Foster to incorporate 2019 Music a'la Carte (aka "Spring Talent Show") into the Nestucca Games next year! 


NHS TRACK



What is Double Up Food Bucks?

Each summer Food Roots facilitates Double Up Food Bucks at farmers markets across the county. Double Up Food Bucks (previously known as SNAP Match) is an incentive program that provides low-income households who receive Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits with a one-to-one match to purchase locally grown fruits and vegetables at farmers markets. Each week a participant is edible for up to a \$10 match to spend on extra in produce. This is a program that support our community in many ways by supporting food insecure families in purchasing more fresh foods, while local farmers gain new customers and increase their profits, and more federal assistance dollars stay in our local economy.

For the past five years, Food Roots has been coordinating this program across our county. In Tillamook County there is a farmers market in Manzanita, Tillamook, Pacific City and Neskowin. All four markets in Tillamook County participate in a SNAP Matching program. Over the course of this program Food Roots has recorded \$36,306.00 of revenue generated at our local farmers markets as a result of SNAP and DUFB sales.
