We are excited to announce that our school district is the recipient of a \$2.4 million grant from the state of Oregon. We applied for this grant to complete a seismic upgrade on the Nestucca High School cafeteria and gym area. You may remember that we received one of these grants for \$1.5 million to seismically upgrade our Nestucca Valley Elementary School a few years ago. This is exciting for our district, that all of our facilities will now be up to seismic code. This work will begin in the summer of 2020 and commence along the same timeline that the bond work at the elementary school does. Thank you Oregon Seismic Rehabilitation Grant Program!!

Our bond work at the elementary school is staying on schedule. We will have a groundbreaking ceremony, in June of 2019. We are close to closing out the design development phase of the project, and then construction documents will begin to be drafted.

This time of year tends to become very busy for all families, as we look to closing out our school year. Please continue to check Friday folders, emails and Facebook for updates. The district has numerous activities planned and is always in need of chaperones. Now would be a good time to make sure that you have a completed criminal back ground check on file, so you can volunteer if your desire to.



## A friendly attendance reminder...

#### Attendance

Research shows that attendance is the single most important factor in school success. Here's how you can improve your student's school attendance:

- \*Talk to your son/daughter about why it's important to attend school regularly (and on time).
- \*Avoid scheduling family trips and doctor appointments during school hours.
- \*Make sure your son/daughter stays healthy by eating nutritious food and getting enough sleep and exercise.
- \*Don't accept excuses for why your student "must" miss or be late for school.
- \*Support school rules and consequences for skipping class and being tardy.

Please contact the Attendance Office staff or school counselor if you have questions or concerns about your son/daughter's school attendance.

<sup>\*</sup> Not all immunizations are required for all grades. These numbers may not total 100% if some children have medical exemptions, or are incomplete or in process with immunizations but do not need an exemption because they are on schedule.

<sup>\*\*</sup>There is/are also **0** child(ren) enrolled for whom immunizations are not required to be reported because their records are tracked by another site or they attend fewer than 5 days per year.

<sup>†</sup>Blanks indicate this vaccine was not required in the grades at this school, or this vaccine was required for fewer than 10 children.



# SUMMER START! Scholarship Application 2019

The *Summer Start Scholarship Program 2019* is a **tuition**, fees, and **textbook** scholarship available to any Tillamook County resident who is either currently enrolled as a student at TBCC or is planning to attend TBCC in the fall. Many new students have pre-requisite courses needed before they are able to enroll in classes that are required for a degree or to apply for specialty programs such as nursing, medical assisting, occupational therapy assisting, and more. Other students might be fresh out of high school and want to get a jump-start on getting some of the required courses out of the way before fall. Candidates who are interested in this scholarship must apply for admission (or be a previously admitted student) at the time of application and be able to enroll in at least one course for the summer term. We are selecting recipients for the *Summer Start Program* based on the quality and completeness of this application.

#### **Eligibility Requirements:**

- Completion of a high school diploma/GED;
- Ability to enroll in at least one undergraduate credit course OR pre-collegiate developmental course;
  - Ability to meet with a TBCC Academic Advisor prior to enrollment;

This scholarship will cover the costs of tuition, fees, and required textbooks for one course during the Summer Term 2019.

We will accept applications for the Summer Start program beginning May 1, 2019 through June 20, 2019, no later than 4:30 p.m.

# Writing Is a Life Skill

he three R's—reading, 'riting and 'rithmetic—have not always gotten equal attention in school, but that's changing.

New programs and tests, like the revised writing-oriented SAT, stress that children need to know how to express themselves clearly and creatively.

While your children will learn how to write well in school, the best place for them to practice their skills and develop a love for writing is at

home. Here are some ways to make writing part of their home lives, both during the school year and in the summertime:

Add writing to your list. Making time for your children to write is as important as making time for reading.

Have the tools on hand. While it's important to always have school supplies

available at home, sometimes all it takes to get children interested in putting pen to paper is letting them choose a fun pen and a special notebook, or giving them their own special time on library or home computer word processing programs.

Write in front of them. Children learn what they experience. Make sure they see you writing—whether it's a letter to a friend, a thankyou note, a journal entry, or a letter to the editor. Ask them to add a few lines or even write their own.

**Praise their work**. Make a big deal of their writing successes. When they've written something creative, fun, or thought-provoking, send copies to their grandparents and put the original on the refrigerator or bulletin board for everyone to admire.

Make a book. If your children enjoy photography, have them collect some favorite pictures and write captions for them, or have

them write short stories that tie them together. Help them make title pages (featuring their name in big letters as the authors), add a few staples, and they've made a book.

E-mails are OK; IMs aren't really writing. This technologically-savvy generation writes more than ever, thanks to computer instant messages (IMs) and e-mails. In fact, the accepted use of symbols and lack of proper grammar may

not help children's efforts at creative writing. While IMs are quick and fun, they do nothing to help children become better writers. E-mails are better because they allow time and space for children to express themselves. Encourage them to send e-mails to you or to other relatives.

Pay attention to song lyrics. If your children

enjoy music, look up the lyrics of their favorite songs. Talk about what the songwriter was saying, and encourage them to try writing their own lyrics about things that are meaningful to them.

Use the Web. Check out a wonderful Internet site geared for children and chock full of writing games and ideas: www.writingfix.com/

Another suggestion is that when you're reading a story or watching a movie together, pause and ask your child a "what if" question—
i.e., "What if the Mom came home while the Cat in the Hat was still in the house? Tell me everything you think would happen then." Then ask your child to write about it.

Writing is much more than a school subject; it's an essential life skill. People who know how to clearly express their opinions, ideas, creativity, and knowledge have a real edge. With your help, your children will be among them.

# INFORME a los PADRES

# Escribir es una Habilidad para la Vida

a lectura, redacción, y matemáticas no siempre han tenido la misma atención en las escuelas, esto esta cambiando. Nuevos programas y exámenes, tales como el examen de orientación escrita de SAT, enfatizan que los niños necesitan saber como expresarse por si mismos con claridad y creatividad.

Si bien es cierto que sus niños aprenderán *cómo* escribir correctamente en la escuela, el mejor lugar para que ellos practiquen estas habilidades y desarrollen cariño hacia la escritura es en el hogar. Aquí hay algunas formas para que la escritura forme parte de sus

vidas, ya sea durante el año escolar o en el verano.

Agregue la escritura a su lista. Dedicar tiempo para que sus niños escriban es tan importante como darles el tiempo para que lean.

Tenga las herramientas adecuadas a mano. Aunque sea importante tener materiales escolares disponibles en casa, a veces lo único que se necesita

para mantener a los niños interesado es proporcionarle el papel, pluma, y cuaderno especial de su elección, o darles tiempo para utilizar la computadora en casa o en la biblioteca y programas para elaboración de textos.

Escriba en frente de ellos. Sus niños aprenden lo que experimentan. Asegúrese de que la vean escribiendo—ya sea escribiendo una carta a un amigo, una carta de agradecimiento, un escrito en su diario, o una carta al editor. Invítelos a que agreguen algunas líneas o que escriban por sí mismos.

Aprecie su trabajo. Enfatice abiertamente que su escritura es extraordinaria. Cuando ellos escriban algo creativo, divertido, o invitante a la reflexión, envíe una copia a sus abuelos y ponga el original en el refrigerador o en una pizarra para que todos puedan admirarlo.

Haga un libro. Si sus niños disfrutan de la fotografía, haga que colecten algunas de sus fotografías predilectas y que escriban acerca del momento o haga que escriban historias cortas acerca de las fotografías. Ayúdelos a crear una pagina de titulo (destaque su

nombre son letras grandes, como el autor), agregue algunas grapas, y ellos habrán hecho un libro

Los E-mails (correos electrónicos) están bien; los mensajes instantáneos no son realmente escritura. Esta generación diestra en tecnología escribe más que nunca, gracias a los mensajes instantáneos por la computadora y los e-mails. De hecho, es muy posible que el uso aceptado de los símbolos y la falta de gramática apropiada no ayuden en los esfuerzos por tener una escritura creativa. A pesar de ser rápidos y divertidos, los mensajes instantáneos tampoco ayudan a

que nuestros niños escriban mejor. Los e-mails son mejores porque permiten que nuestros niños tengan el tiempo y espacio para que se puedan expresar. Aliéntelos a que le envíen e-mails a usted y a otros parientes.

Ponga atención a las letras de las canciones. Si sus niños disfrutan de la música, busque la letra de sus canciones favoritas.

Converse acerca de lo que el escritor de la canción esta diciendo, y aliéntelos a que ellos traten de escribir acerca de cosas que les sean significativas.

Utilice la Web. Busque algún sitio extraordinario en la Web orientado hacia jóvenes que esté repleto de juegos escritos e ideas: www.writingfix.com/

Otra sugerencia es que cuando lean una historia, o vean una película, juntos pause y le haga preguntas a su niño tales como "¿que tal si?" Por ejemplo, "¿Que tal si la madre llegara a la casa mientras el Gato del Sombrero estuviera en la casa? Dígame todo que tu piensas entonces sucedería. Despues, pregunta a su niño a escribir sobre eso.

El escribir es mucho más que un proyecto escolar; es una habilidad esencial para la vida. Las personas que saben como expresar con claridad sus opiniones, ideas, creatividad, y conocimiento tienen una gran ventaja. Con su ayuda, sus niños estarán entre ellos.
