



The 2022 Track and Field season, despite unusually wet weather, was a big success! With a mixture of returning experienced athletes and a crop of athletes new to the sport, the season opened with high expectations. As athletes tried different events during the season, it was fun to see their improvements day to day and meet to meet. NHS track has always been about improvement, measured in PRs (Personal Records, lifetime bests).

We had three meets this year with over 40 PRs for the combined team! The girls team got two to State this year, with 3 year State participant Kelsie Thurston scoring a 7th place finish in the shot put, and Rookie of the Year Makayla Webber scoring two medals (200 meters and 400 meters). The District Champion Boys Team demolished all league competition and took 5 to State- Cody Hagerty (3rd place pole vault), Draven Marsh(boys Rookie of the Year) in pole vault, Miguel Pimienta (defending State Champ went in 300 hurdles, high hurdles and triple jump) scored a medal in the high hurdles, Most Inspirational Skyler Wallace qualified in the discus throw and high jump (8th place medal in discus), and Mr Spike (MVP) Jaysson Swirtz (defending State javelin champ) collected 4 Individual District Championships and earned a medal in all 4 at State, the first Bobcat to ever accomplish that feat!

Coach Elder commented- "This was a really fun group to coach and watch develop. They all worked hard, and the success they had was definitely earned. I'll always remember the positive attitudes and willingness to try new events to help the team success. It was a great group to bring my 39 years as
